CASTLE ACRE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

If there was one thing missing from most of our recreational spaces this summer, it was that quintessential feature of the English landscape: lush, GREEN grass! A lawn in late August is rarely the finest moment in any garden but this year we hardly had chance to GROW a lawn, let alone mow one!

You may be a gardener with 'bowling-green' aspirations, or you might be content with a 'family-games' turf of robust quality, but it's usually around the middle of July when wear-and-tear starts to creep in: those tell-tale patches in the cricket pitch and swing-ball areas, some flattened growth which never quite recovers from Grandpa's heroic leap to get to the ball before it hits the neighbour's fence.....by September, the joys of school holidays may have begun to take their toll on our gardens, but the lawn *will* start to recover (even if Grandpa doesn't quite).....and that's because grass is 'special'. It grows from the base (not from the tip) and that's why it will survive constant grazing, mowing, drought, even fire — plus the rough and tumble of most family games! A vast network of underground roots and the process of 'transpiration' help grass to cool our surrounding air and — most importantly — to draw in and store massive amounts of carbon from the atmosphere.

Keep loving your lawn and helping your garden's biodiversity and keep your secateurs handy for active 'deadheading' to encourage a fresh flush of beautiful autumn blooms (especially if you can rustle up some rainwater!).

Dahlias, roses, cosmos, artemesia, daisies, gazanias - they'll all keep going for a while longer. Stay cool, enjoy that nice brown 'lawn' and a game of cricket while you can — and happy Autumn gardening in our changed climate!

Hort Soc's Annual Show (5th September at the Village Hall) has become a village tradition, providing us with the perfect opportunity to display the results of our hard work in gardens, greenhouses and kitchens. We're very grateful for everyone's enthusiasm and support and we're especially indebted to our judges and all who acted as stewards — without them, small village shows like ours could not continue.

CASTLE ACRE PARISH COUNCIL – JULY REPORT 2026

On Thursday 9th July 2026, Castle Acre Parish Council (PC) held its regular monthly meeting, six members of the public attended.

Non-Conformist Burial Ground

Castle Acre PC can happily share the news that as of 08/07/2026 current planned works to the 'Non-Conformist Burial Ground' (opposite The Castle) are now complete with the final capping stones placed on the left-hand pier and gate re-hung. Sincere thanks go to The Wicken for the loan of a JCB Telehandler with operator and to a local Builder for placing them. This project represents an incredible volume of research work from the Heritage Group, led by Cllr Anne Mason with the help of National Lottery Heritage Funding. Special mention and thanks go to the volunteers who continue to maintain the site. You are all appreciated, thank you.

Potholes De Warrene Place

CAPC would like to say sincere thanks to Borough Cllr Alistair Beales for arranging further works to the unadopted road at De Warrene Place. Potholes were repaired on 08/07/2026 with the cost of the repair shared 50/50 once more between KLWNBC and Freebridge Housing Association. A great example of our local authorities working together for the benefit of residents. Thank you.

The River Nar SSSI Flea Treatment Advice by Cllr Manson

Castle Acre Parish is incredibly lucky to have the River Nar running through it. The river and surrounding areas are an internationally important habitat, a unique chalk stream that is classified as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). The river area is enjoyed by many people carrying out a variety of activities e.g. naturalists, ramblers, dog walkers, club fishing and occasional swimmers.

Part of responsible dog ownership is ensuring they are kept free and healthy from parasites. One flea can lay up to 15,000 eggs in a month, rapidly creating an infestation and leading to serious health issues for the animal. Ticks are commonplace all year round due to increased wildlife hosts and can transit serious conditions to dogs and people e.g. Lyme Disease.

The use of preventative antiparasitic medication is an important way of controlling such parasites. However, a potential side effect of using flea and tick treatments is that some can contaminate natural water sources, affecting important insect life in the habitat. Less modern flea products carry a greater risk as they are often topical in their action (stay in and on the dog's coat and skin) and are often water soluble. This includes products containing fipronil or selamectin. These treatments can wash off a dog's coat when they swim in water. Most modern flea treatments have been developed with active ingredients that can be given orally or by periodic injection. This means the active ingredient remains within the body rather than topically (externally) in the hair and skin. As they are more targeted, they can also be given at lower concentrations.

THE DROVES SOLAR 'FARM' / POWER STATION

On Tuesday 7th July 2026, West Acre Theatre kindly hosted a meeting between representatives of Island Green Power (The Drovers) RWE (High Grove) with representatives from Castle Acre Parish Council, Sporle Parish Council, Holme Hale Parish Council and further 'Interested Parties'.

The meeting was set up to discuss the 'cumulative' impacts of both solar plant projects sited either side of the A1065. Topics covered included the objections raised by the MOD & RAF Marham, transport, traffic impacts, fire risks, battery storage siting, water management and deer. Any potential Community Benefit fund was not touched upon at the meeting.

Sincere thanks go to West Acre Theatre and to all who attended. Draft minutes of the meeting are available from the Clerk, Amy Hart, upon request.

The Planning Inspectorate has confirmed that the next round of hearings are provisionally booked for the w/c 7th September 2026.

Castle Acre Parish Council would also like to say a sincere thank you to our MP James Wild for agreeing to take part in a 'Community Conversation', 21st August 2026 at Castle Acre Village Hall 7-9pm.

This was a chance for residents and locals to ask questions and have their voices heard regarding the proposed development and its impacts including questions and concerns on environmental / traffic impact, property values and more.

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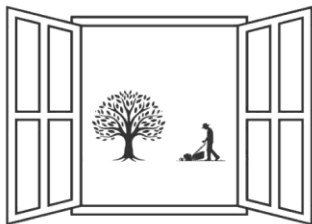
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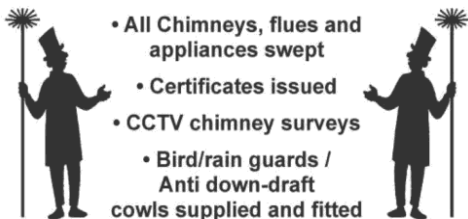


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ARE YOU A VETERAN IN THE SWAFFHAM AREA?

WEST NORFOLK BEFRIENDING

West Norfolk Befriending matches trained volunteers with socially isolated people aged 65+, over half of whom are 85+.

Our clients struggle to leave home because of poor mobility, sight or hearing loss, or caring responsibilities. We're a small local charity reliant on local support to reach some of West Norfolk's most vulnerable people.

Introduced during Covid-19 lockdowns, telephone befriending lets us support more people safely and remains an alternative to face-to-face visits. Our volunteers visit or call fortnightly for companionship, "bringing the outside in" through a chat, reminiscence, family news, stories or time outdoors.

Social isolation and loneliness can seriously affect mental and physical health. A regular friendly visit helps keep communities safe and well, and may reduce pressure on GPs and hospitals.

NARBOROUGH BONE MILL – HERITAGE OPEN DAY

Come and enjoy history on your doorstep and the countryside along the SSSI River Nar on Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th September 2026 at the Narborough Bone Mill from 11am until 4pm. Entry is free.

Enjoy a lovely walk along the River Nar (approximately 1 mile from the car park); if you are lucky, you might see the kingfisher! When you arrive on site you can see the remains of the mill, items discovered (including part of a human skull), the model of what the mill would have looked like and watch the grace and beauty of the 16 ft water wheel turning. Have a chat with the volunteers about the history of the mill, look through our photo albums of our progress and read about the mill's history, whilst enjoying a hot or cold beverage and homemade cakes, all free but donations are very much appreciated.

Everyone is welcome, including dogs. The site is situated approximately 1 mile along the beautiful River Nar from the car park at the Maltings, Narborough PE32 1TE. NARBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL SUMMER REPORT 2026

I hope you all have had a lovely summer.

At Narborough Parish Council's July meeting, Maurice King was co-opted to the Parish Council. Cllr King will be granted dispensation until May 2027 when the Parish Council election can be held. Chairman Cllr Wilkinson thanked Councillors and welcomed Cllr King to the Council.

It was reported that Breckland Council will continue to take a robust approach to the proposed Drove Solar Panel so called "Farm" across the Nar Valley.

Norfolk as well as other parts of the country will have to embrace solar green energy, but these farms must be located in appropriate areas where they must not impact on residents, businesses and disturb wildlife habitats.

Breckland Council has invested in more CCTV coverage in the Breckland Market towns to cover black spots. It is also employing more town street wardens whose task is to patrol the town streets to prevent anti-social behaviour (ASB). The wardens will be deployed to Breckland villages where ASB is reported.

Hopefully, all Nar Valley residents will have received their food waste caddies with an information leaflet. This simpler food waste legislation has been enforced on all local authorities in England and Wales by the Government. This includes a 7 litre indoor kitchen caddy and a 23 litre caddy for outside and roadside weekly collection; both have lockable handles to prevent spills, smells and pests. Nar Valley roadside collections are scheduled for the week commencing 7th September. There will be a 12 week bedding-in period, for residents and Serco to familiarise themselves with this service.

PENTNEY PARISH COUNCIL – JULY REPORT 2026

On Wednesday 15th July 2026, Pentney Parish Council (PC) held its regular monthly meeting; two members of the public attended. No meeting was held in August.

New Clerk & Councillor! Pentney Parish Council would like to extend a warm welcome to our new Clerk, Amy Hart, who comes to us with valuable Clerking experience from Castle Acre Parish Council and is currently qualifying with CILCA (Certificate in Local Council Administration). Amy commenced her role on 8th June 2026. Further good news is that Pentney Parish Council is currently full, having recently filled its 'last seat' by extending an offer to Cllr Majid Yazdian-Tehrani, a long-standing resident of Pentney and member of the Village Hall Committee. Pentney PC looks forward to working with both Amy and Cllr Yazdian-Tehrani.

Narborough Road Bus Shelter Refurbishment: Residents may notice that the successful refurbishment of Pentney Bus Shelter was completed in April 2026 by a local contractor, including works to the roof and internal paint refresh. It is further welcome news, that upon recent request via the Norfolk County Council 'Bus Shelter Funding Scheme', NCC Highways will be covering 80% of the total cost of the works and providing £1,728 (80%) of the £2,160 total cost. As a further update, NCC Highways have also committed to financing and ordering 'raised curbs' for both sides of the road to further aid inclusivity and access. Further works are scheduled in the coming months.

Thank you to our litter pickers & Speed Awareness Co-ordinator: Pentney PC has sincere thanks to express this month, the first being to the resident couple who have, for more years than can be counted, dedicated themselves to picking litter and ensuring that the roadsides and public spaces in the village have been kept nothing short of spotless. The lack of litter in Pentney has over the years been noticed not just by our Councillors, but by residents and visitors to the village too. The Parish Council would like to wish these resident volunteers all the very best for their retirement after 'hanging up' their gloves and litter picking duties this month. Thank you for all the time you have given and for all you have done.

The Parish Council would also like to say a sincere thanks to the Resident who has for several years undertaken our Speed Awareness Co-ordinator role and has made a hugely valuable and ongoing contribution to the village, keeping drivers, residents and visitors to Pentney much safer on the roads. Our volunteer downloads monthly data and creates reports using Pentney PC's two SAM2 speed monitors stationed in 14 locations across the Village.

Did you know? According to the SAM2 speed monitors, between April 2025 and April 2026, a total of 189,619 journeys were made through Pentney village, of which 44,553 (23.5%) were of a speed above 32.8mph. We can only imagine what these figures would be without the dedicated volunteer help we continue to receive as a village...
