CLERGY THOUGHTS

A NEW SONG TO THE LORD.

*"Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth.
Sing to the Lord, praise his name..." (Ps 96)*

I wonder what your new song is today – the song on your heart expressed outward or sounded within - in the sense of how your heart and soul rejoice for all that God is for you. Some of us will consider ourselves singers and sing out for joy – others will not consider themselves as such, but will have songs on our hearts that arise when we celebrate and realise anew each day what God has done for us, and how he lives through us – how can we not? Much times they will be personal, and sometimes possibly shared.

I don't speak about songs, such as in worship – though they may become that, but simply that which arises within because we are loved and love. What seems to be important, from scripture is the refreshments of our song – new songs – whether of celebratory praise or anxious lament (just like the psalms) – and giving new songs time seems to be a great encouragement of scripture and for our faith – this encouragement is given particularly through the Psalms (Ps 33:3, Ps 96:1, Ps 98:1, Ps144:9, Ps 149:1). Even Isaiah encourages this when out of the deep darkness of God's people's predicament new glimmers of hope arise - so 'Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, praise his name...'.

Outwardly or inwardly simply singing a 'new song' (however we do it) helps us spend time and focus on God – to honour his presence and love, to plant each new day deeply in the source of his life in us. I have enjoyed reading the poetry of Michael Symons Roberts again this summer, and he encourages us in one of his poems called 'A New Song': -

Sing a new song to the Lord,
sing through the skin of your teeth,
sing in the code of your blood,
sing with a throat full of earth,

sing to the quick of your nails,
sing from the knots of your lungs
sing like aa dancer on coals,
sing as a madman in tongues,

sing as if singing made sense,
sing in the caves of your heart
sing like you want them to dance,
sing through the shades of your past,

sing what you never could say,
sing at the fulcrum of joy,
sing without need of reply.

(from the collection 'Drysalter' by Michael Symons Roberts – born 1963)

May I encourage you, and I hope you will me, to flourish through our new heart songs.

CURATES' CORNER

A TIME TO LISTEN

"Turn! Turn! Turn!" — many of us will know the song made famous by The Byrds in 1965, with its words drawn from Ecclesiastes:

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

a time to be born, and a time to die;

a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted..."

There is something deeply familiar in those words. Life moves through seasons, and so does our life with God. Perhaps one of the most important things we can learn is that God calls us in God's time, rather than necessarily in ours.

Florence Nightingale is remembered as someone who felt 'called' to nursing. She understood her vocation not simply as a career choice, but as something to which God was drawing her. Her life reminds us that a calling can emerge quietly, sometimes over many years, and that responding to God may mean stepping into something we had not expected.

God's call is not always dramatic. Sometimes it is a gentle stirring: *Is there something more? Is God inviting me to grow? Is this a new season in my life? And, of course, some of us are very well seasoned already!

As we approach Creationtide, (1 September to 4 October) the Church invites us to give particular attention to God as Creator and Sustainer of all life, giving thanks for creation and considering afresh our responsibility to care for it.

Perhaps that is a helpful invitation for us too: to pause, to notice, and to listen.

Are you feeling moved or called to respond to God in some new way? Might this be a season in your life for a deeper relationship with Him, or for becoming more deeply involved in the life of your church community? Perhaps there is a gift, an interest or a possibility that has been quietly growing within you, waiting for the right season.

You'll be aware, perhaps, from information I shared a short while ago, that on the Island, a new Authorised Lay Ministry course is being planned. There are more details in the poster shared again with this Bulletin. It may be just the opportunity you have been looking for — or it may simply prompt a question worth asking. 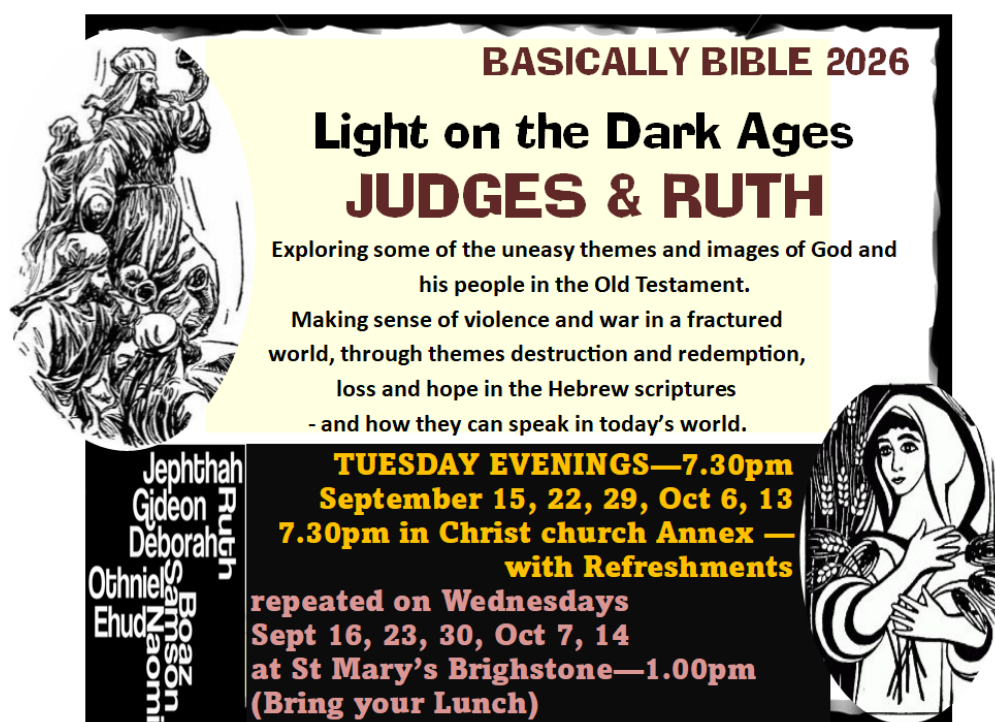
Of course, not every stirring is a call, and not every new season requires a new direction. But perhaps, in the quietness of prayer, it is worth asking:

SPECIAL REQUEST FROM ANNE POWELL - WEST WIGHT ANNA CHAPLAIN



I hope you have all been enjoying this wonderful summer!

Sadly, the evenings are already drawing in but it does give the opportunity for us to pick up our knitting needles again!

Starting the last week of October and into early November, I will again be leading "Services of Remembering" in all the Residential Care Homes in West Wight. These services include elements from both the All-Souls Service and Remembrance Sunday and they are always appreciated by the residents. For the past few years, it has become a tradition to give Knitted Poppies to the residents - again much appreciated.

If you feel able to help by knitting a few poppies, the pattern is very simple:

You will need: Any red double knitting yarn, a pair of 4mm (size 8) knitting needles, a small black button for the centre

- Cast on 60 stitches
- Rows 1 - 8: K2 P2 to the end
- Row 9: K2 together to the end (30 stitches remain)
- Row 10: S2kpo to the end (10 stitches remain)
- Break off yarn, leaving a long tail, thread this through the remaining 10 stitches and pull tight, stitch the edges of the poppy together and sew the black button in the centre of the poppy,

It is helpful if you can also fix a medium sized safety pin to the underside of the poppy so that it can be easily fixed to the residents clothing. Crocheted poppies are equally acceptable if that is your preference!
