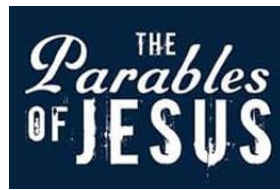

Dear Friends,

Harvest is always a time for gratitude, but perhaps this year that gratitude feels particularly important. We have come through a year of drought, when the lack of rain has reminded us how dependent we are upon things beyond our control.

Farmers and those of us who are gardeners have watched the skies, waited for the rain and worked hard to bring crops to harvest. Fields have needed water, gardens have needed care, and the weather has shown us just how precious these ordinary things can be.

It is far too easy to take food for granted. We go into a shop and find shelves filled with bread, fruit, vegetables and all that we need. Yet behind every loaf of bread and every meal there is hard work; soil, seed, sunshine and rain; there is the work of farmers and many others; and ultimately there is God's blessing.

The story of creation reminds us that the earth is not simply ours to exploit but God's gift given to us to care for. Harvest time invites us not only to give thanks for what we have received, but also to remember the importance of caring for the world and for one another.

This year, perhaps more than most, we have been reminded that we cannot control everything. We can plough, sow and cultivate, but we can't make it rain. We can plan and work, but we remain dependent upon a bigger picture we can't control. And so, Harvest becomes a prayer of trust as well as thanksgiving:

'Thank you, God, for all that you provide. Help us to receive your gifts with grateful hearts, to share generously with those who have less, and to care wisely for the earth entrusted to us. Amen'
