Season of Creation

The Season of Creation runs from 1 September to 4 October (Feast of St Francis).

From Sunday, 6 September - the Festival of Creation in Christ - we shall be offering a daily reflection on the theme of Living Water (Ezekiel 47.9-12). This will be sent by email. If you would like to receive these, and do not have regular emails from the Church, please speak to David.

In addition, we shall have a weekly Pledge Card, focussing on an aspect of our use of water. The returns can be added to the offertory, if you wish.

And thirdly, at 3pm on Saturdays, we shall be taking a short walk from Old Glossop



Church to a place of water. When there, we shall ask for God's blessing on the water, returning to Church for refreshments afterwards.



Eco Tip of the week

Water saving at home

1. Water efficient shower heads - Daily showers account for one of the biggest water uses in the home. A typical shower lasts 8 minutes, and uses 62 litres of hot water. Power showers often use more water and energy than a bath. Water efficient shower heads are a cost effective and a good way to save water in your home. They control the flow, spray pattern and volume of water.

2. Water saving cisterns - Flushing your toilet accounts for up to 30% of the water used in your home. Installing a water saving cistern, reduces the water in your flush by 1-3 litres. Furthermore, a Save-a-Flush device is a bag of crystals which when placed in your toilet cistern will expand and save around 1 litre of water every time you flush.
