Christ in Creation - reflection

The calming of the storm in Matthew 8: 23-27 offers a profound theological anchor for the Church of England's new festival, Christ in Creation.

When Jesus commands the wind and waves to "be still," he is not merely performing a rescue mission; he is revealing his identity as the divine Creator, as he taught us to pray, "for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen."

For a world facing the turbulent storms of climate change and the degradation of the natural world, this narrative shifts our perspective from fear to active, faithful stewardship, to trusting in God's mission for the world.

The festival of Christ in Creation invites the Church to move beyond viewing nature as a mere background to human salvation. Instead, it celebrates a cosmic Christ who is Lord of all, who is intimately connected to his world and to us whom he placed within it. The disciples' panic reflects our own anxiety about environmental collapse. Yet, Jesus' rebuke of the storm reminds us that the earth belongs to God, and everything in it and its restoration is central to the Gospel message.

Let us pray

.... And now we give you thanks because in him, our risen Lord, the new creation is being brought to perfection, a broken world is being renewed, and creation itself will share in the glorious liberty of the children of God. Amen

For you shall go out in joy,
and be led back in peace;

instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle;
and it shall be to the Lord for a memorial,
for an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off.

2nd Reading: Colossians 1.15–20

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth

were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Gospel: John 1.1–14

Glory to you, O Lord

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

Glory to you, O Lord

And when he got into the boat, his disciples followed him. A gale arose on the lake, so great that the boat was being swamped by the waves; but he was asleep. And they went and woke him up, saying, 'Lord, save us! We are perishing!' And he said to them, 'Why are you afraid, you of little faith?' Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a dead calm. They were amazed, saying, 'What sort of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey him?'
