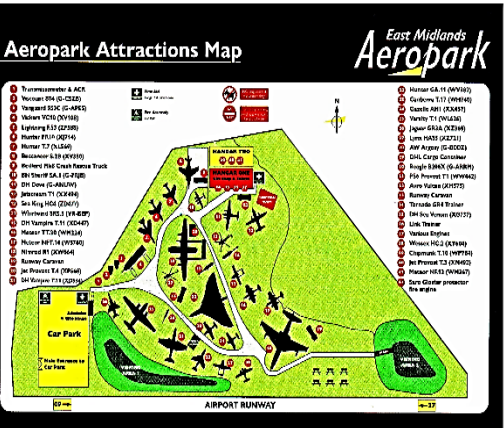

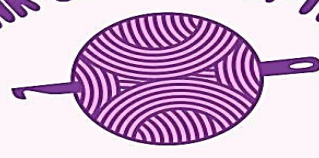

September is the month we celebrate the Season of Creation and this year along with tips to help us be good stewards to God's Creation, we especially look at **"Living Water"**. Inspired by Ezekiel 47:1-12, the season focuses on how God's life-giving water restores barren land, revives ecosystems, and calls for human responsibility in climate justice and water stewardship. Each week we will include tips of how look after God's world and use water wisely. This week's tips are :-

13th September – Our daily bread

Don't buy more food than you need. Try to buy unwrapped and unpackaged if you can
Consider growing your own vegetables, possibly in a grow bag – you won't have to go to the shops for lettuce, tomato, etc
If you're not vegetarian, consider having one or two vegetarian meals a week
Create a compost bin for waste vegetables and peelings etc. You can use it for newspaper, shredding from your shredder, cardboard, dust from the vacuum cleaner, garden waste etc.
Could you share an allotment or gardening with anyone and share the produce?
Buy organic if you can as it is produced without using artificial chemicals. It is thus better for the environment.
Buy local / UK produce as much as possible and try to buy loose fruit and vegetables rather than covered in plastic
Buying seasonal will mean cutting down on food-air-miles from exotic countries. E.g. eat strawberries only in summer when they don't have to be imported from abroad.
Love Food Hate Waste campaign <http://www.lovefoodhatewaste.com> / has lots of tips on proper storage of food and using up left-overs or food that is slightly out of date, e.g. cereal, apples, potatoes, broccoli
Look for the Fair Trade symbol when shopping and always consider buying Fair Trade. Check out the Co-Op. They stock lots of Fair Trade products
Consider using products like shampoo and cleaning liquids which are good for the environment:- see <https://www.ethicalsuperstore.com/>

Water Saving Tips

Shower rather than bath and shorten your shower

Four minutes total should do it. Setting a timer is easier than it sounds.

Fix those leaks A dripping tap can waste up to 15 litres a day, while a leaky loo



loses 400



Simple swaps



Swap the hose for a bucket or watering can You'll do the same job with much less water. **Use a washing up bowl** If it takes you more than a minute to do the dishes, you'll save water with a bowl.

Go eco mode for your appliances Eco mode on your dishwasher and washing machine can save up to 10 litres a day.



Plan ahead



Install a dual flush toilet

They can save up to 42 litres a day.



Upgrade your shower head

A proper water saving head can halve your water use.

If we keep using water like we do now, by 2055, we could be short by 5 billion litres a day in England.

We all use more water than we think. The average person estimates they use 30 litres a day; it's nearer 140 litres. Saving 28 litres (about a kitchen sink full) in England or 38 litres (3 buckets) in Wales per person, per day will ensure there's enough water for generations to come.
