The Freedom Centre work with local members of our community who struggle with homelessness, addiction and other life challenges.

Working with other agencies, their heart is to meet with individuals at their point of need and walk with them towards a more positive, hopeful and purposeful future.

They also provide safe supported housing for more than 50 people at any one time who may otherwise be homeless and, their partnership team operates an outreach service to those who continue to rough sleep in the area, to make sure they are cared for and their essential needs are met.

The food donations that are provided are used in their Day Centre kitchen and help those in need whilst at the same time keeping their costs down to enable money to be spent in other areas of need.

Below is a list of current requirements needed to keep their kitchen running and provide food parcels for clients:

Meals in a tin e.g. chilli, stew and curry

Tinned fruit e.g. pineapple chunks, pears, rhubarb, apple or mandarins

Custard powder

Chopped tomatoes

White easy cook rice

Coffee

Pot noodles

Granola bars

Chocolate bars, large and small

Orange juice – large or small cartons

White Flour – self raising and plain

Granulated white sugar and caster sugar

Icing sugar

Jelly – any flavour

Tomato puree and Worcestershire sauce

Herbs and spices: Rosemary, thyme, cumin and garam masala

Lemon juice and Vanilla essence

Sunflower oil

Washing up liquid

Also needed are:

Men's spray deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes

Please **DO NOT SEND** tinned soup, pasta, spaghetti or tea as they have a huge amount of them.
