Old Testament Reading: Job 37:14–24

“Hear this, O Job;
stop and consider the wondrous works of God.
Do you know how God lays his command upon them
and causes the lightning of his cloud to shine?
Do you know the balancings of the clouds, the wondrous
works of the one whose knowledge is perfect,
you whose garments are hot
when the earth is still because of the south wind?
Can you, like him, spread out the skies,
hard as a molten mirror?
Teach us what we shall say to him;
we cannot draw up our case because of darkness.
Should he be told that I want to speak?
Did anyone ever wish to be swallowed up?
Now, no one can look on the light when it is bright in the
skies, when the wind has passed and cleared them.
Out of the north comes golden splendour;
around God is awesome majesty.
The Almighty—we cannot find him;
he is great in power and justice,
and abundant righteousness he will not violate.
Therefore mortals fear him;
he does not regard any who are wise in their own conceit.”

Psalm: Psalm 130

Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord.
**Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive
to the voice of my supplications!**
If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities,
Lord, who could stand?
**But there is forgiveness with you,
so that you may be revered.**
I wait for the Lord; my soul waits, and in his word I hope;
**my soul waits for the Lord
more than those who watch for the morning,
more than those who watch for the morning.**
O Israel, hope in the Lord! For with the Lord there is
steadfast love, and with him is great power to redeem.
It is he who will redeem Israel from all its iniquities.

New Testament Reading: Revelation 4

After this I looked, and there in heaven a door stood open!
And the first voice, which I had heard speaking to me like a
trumpet, said, “Come up here, and I will show you what must
take place after this.” At once I was in the spirit, and there in
heaven stood a throne, with one seated on the throne! And
the one seated there looks like jasper and carnelian, and
around the throne is a rainbow that looks like an emerald.
Around the throne are twenty-four thrones, and seated on
the thrones are twenty-four elders, dressed in white robes,
with golden crowns on their heads. Coming from the throne
are flashes of lightning and rumblings and peals of thunder,
and in front of the throne burn seven flaming torches, which
are the seven spirits of God, and in front of the throne there
is something like a sea of glass, like crystal.

Around the throne, and on each side of the throne, are four
living creatures, full of eyes in front and back: the first living
creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the
third living creature with a face like a human, and the fourth
living creature like a flying eagle. And the four living
creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all
around and inside. Day and night without ceasing they sing,

“Holy, holy, holy,
the Lord God the Almighty,
who was and is and is to come.”

And whenever the living creatures give glory and honour and
thanks to the one who is seated on the throne, who lives
forever and ever, the twenty-four elders fall before the one
who is seated on the throne and worship the one who lives
forever and ever; they cast their crowns before the throne,
singing,

“You are worthy, our Lord and God,
to receive glory and honour and power,
for you created all things,
and by your will they existed and were created.”

Gospel Reading: Matthew 8:23–27

And when he got into the boat, his disciples followed him. A
windstorm suddenly arose on the sea, so great that the boat
was being swamped by the waves, but he was asleep. And

they went and woke him up, saying, “Lord, save us! We are
perishing!” And he said to them, “Why are you afraid, you of
little faith?” Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the
sea, and there was a dead calm. They were amazed, saying,
“What sort of man is this, that even the winds and the sea
obey him?”
