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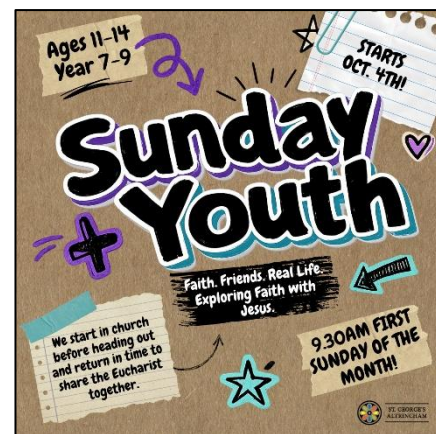

With **games**, **food** (of course!), and a short **thought for the week**, it's the perfect way to catch up with old primary school friends and unwind after a busy week.

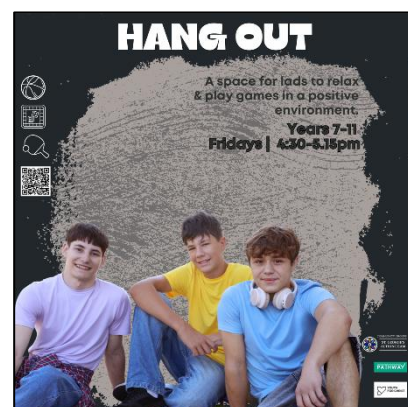
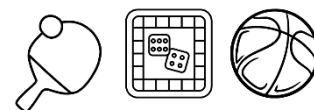
**Hang Out** starts Friday 11<sup>th</sup> September, Parish Centre, 4.30pm

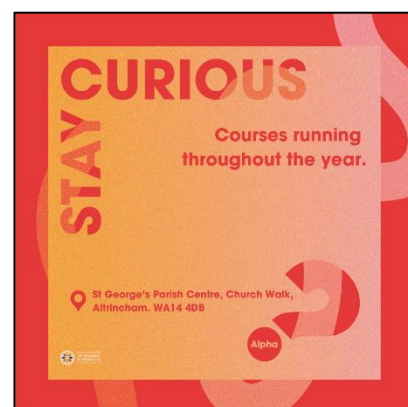

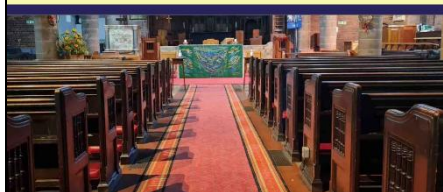

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## Reflection on the Season: The gift of ordinary routines

It's funny how, despite no longer being at school (or working in one) September still shapes my year. After a childhood measured by school terms, followed by many years as a teacher, I'm beginning to wonder if those rhythms never really leave you.

In many ways, September feels more like a New Year than January. It's the season when bags are packed once again, alarm clocks are dusted off, diaries begin to fill, and familiar routines quickly return. For a few days everything feels fresh and full of possibility. Then, almost before we notice, life settles back into the ordinary.

But I wonder whether that's actually something to be thankful for.

After the long (and, this year, particularly hot) summer, perhaps it's the return of the ordinary that many of us find reassuring. Familiar faces. Regular routines. The comforting rhythm of everyday life.

We often celebrate the extraordinary moments in life - the holidays, the milestones, the big achievements - but most of life isn't lived there. It's lived in the everyday: making the tea, walking the dog, catching the train, chatting to a neighbour, turning up week after week for family, friends and community.

The Bible reminds us that faith is often shaped in those ordinary moments too. Love, kindness, patience and generosity are rarely built overnight. More often, they grow through countless small choices made day after day. There is something deeply hopeful about that. We don't need every day to be remarkable for our lives to be meaningful.

As another season begins, perhaps routine is less something to endure and more something to embrace. Within its familiar rhythms are opportunities to notice God at work in the ordinary: in conversations over coffee, moments of quiet prayer, acts of service, shared laughter and simple acts of kindness.

So, as September unfolds, may we not rush past the everyday in search of something bigger. Instead, may we discover that God's presence is often found in the faithful rhythm of ordinary life, quietly shaping us into the people he calls us to be.

Sometimes the most extraordinary thing we can do is simply keep showing up – with open hearts, willing hands, and the expectation that even the most ordinary day can become holy.



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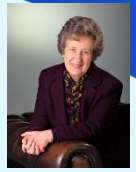
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# GOING DEEPER

The Feast of St Michael and All Angels (September 29) has been celebrated by the English church since Anglo-Saxon times, but the common name for it — Michaelmas (St Michael's Mass) — is not found in written records until the thirteenth century. In addition to being an ecclesiastical feast day, it was one of the Quarter Days, on which rents were paid, tenancies and leases were begun or ended, and certain other contracts were entered into. The other Quarter Days are Lady Day (25 March, called Lady Day because it is the Feast of the Annunciation), the Feast of John the Baptist (24 June, Midsummer Day), and Christmas Day. This tradition of financial and legal Quarter Days continued in some areas of activity until quite recent times and, for all I know, may still continue in some of the nooks and crannies of English life. Scotland has Quarter Days too, but on different dates.

In the western church the veneration of Michael began in the 490s, when he is said to have appeared in a vision on Monte Gargano on the Adriatic coast of southern Italy. According to one version of the legend, a wealthy man called Garganus had a wilful bull which deserted the herd of cattle and was tracked down to the mouth of a cave on the mountain. Garganus tried to shoot it, but an extraordinary gust of wind turned the arrow back and killed him instead of the bull. The local people, on the advice of their bishop, prayed for understanding of what had happened. Three days later the Archangel Michael appeared and explained that he had chosen the cave as his special place and did not want to have it violated. The local people thereupon honoured the place, and Michael subsequently helped them in battle against neighbouring heathens who, following their defeat, converted to Christianity. An alternative legend describes how Michael appeared to some shepherds in the cave and left them his red cloak. Monte Gargano became a pilgrimage site, and the cult quickly spread. Two of the most notable sites in our part of the world are Mont-Saint-Michel off the coast of Normandy, supposedly founded by St Aubert in the eighth century to house part of St Michael's cloak, which he had brought from Italy, and St Michael's Mount in Cornwall, about which traditions are rather more vague! The strongest mental image we probably have is of Epstein's sculpture of Michael killing the dragon, which is on the side of the modern Coventry Cathedral. This, like its predecessor, which was destroyed by a bomb in 1940, is dedicated to St Michael.

Michael is referred to in Daniel 12 v. 1, Jude v. 9, and Revelations 12 v.7-9. His name probably means 'like unto God'. When Cranmer created the Church of England's Book of Common Prayer in the sixteenth century, he eliminated many of the Catholic feast-days, but he retained the one for Michael, perhaps because he is a biblical figure, and perhaps also because, as a Quarter Day, Michaelmas was too deeply embedded in English culture to be left out. The other three Quarter Days automatically had their place in the BCP calendar because they met Cranmer's criteria of being feast-days commemorating New Testament figures and events. The addition The name of the feast-day became 'St Michael and all Angels' in 1969 when the Pope extended the commemoration to include Archangels Raphael and Gabriel, and angels more generally. Raphael and Gabriel had each previously had their own feast-days in the Roman calendar.
