a longing for an innocence lost.

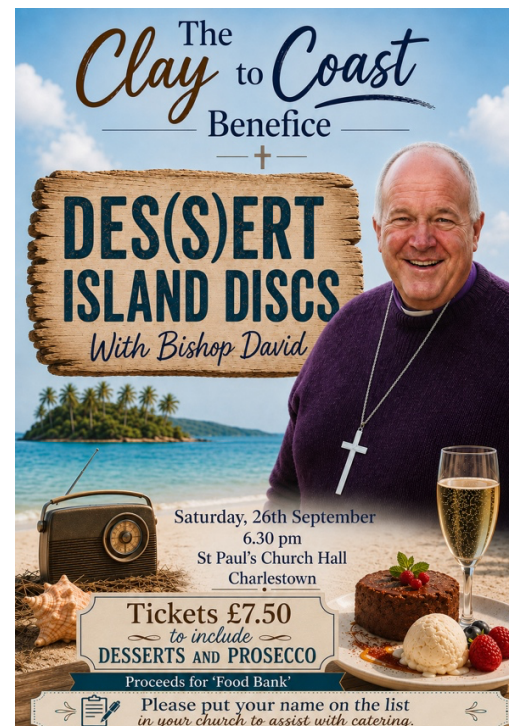
We come remembering those who lost their lives
