¹ O sing to the Lord a new
song;
sing to the Lord, all the
earth.
² Sing to the Lord; bless his
name;
tell of his salvation from day
to day.
³ Declare his glory among the

his marvellous works among
all the peoples.
⁴ For great is the Lord and
greatly to be praised;
he is to be revered above all
gods.

⁵ For all the gods of the
peoples are idols,
but the Lord made the
heavens.

Colossians 1.15–20

He is the image of the
invisible God, the firstborn of
all creation; for in him all
things in heaven and on earth
were created, things visible
and invisible, whether
thrones or dominions or
rulers or powers—all things
have been created through
him and for him. He himself
is before all things, and in him
all things hold together.

He is the head of the body,
the church; he is the
beginning, the firstborn from
the dead, so that he might
come to have first place in
everything. For in him all the
fullness of God was pleased
to dwell, and through him
God was pleased to reconcile
to himself all things, whether
on earth or in heaven, by
making peace through the
blood of his cross.

And when he got into the
boat, his disciples followed
him. A gale arose on the lake,
so great that the boat was
being swamped by the waves;
but he was asleep. And they
went and woke him up,
saying, Lord, save us! We are
perishing! And he said to
them, Why are you afraid,
you of little faith? Then he
got up and rebuked the
winds and the sea; and there
was a dead calm.
They were amazed, saying,
What sort of man is this, that
even the winds and the sea
obey him?
