

News from the Belfry

During the past year, we have been asked to ring at a number of weddings. Vanessa, one of our ringers, is our wedding co-ordinator and she is responsible for finding a band of ringers. With six bells, at least six ringers are required. If they cannot be sourced from our St. Peter's band, then she will approach All Saints Inworth, St. Mary Tollesbury and St. Peter Goldhanger, with whom we have close ties. The bells are rung up in readiness a few hours before the wedding service. The ringers enter the church whilst the registers are being signed and then commence ringing as the bride and groom leave the church. After 10 to 15 minutes, there is a pause whilst the band has a break or changes ringers. Ringing ends when the guests have left the churchyard and the bells are then rung down.

When a bell ringer marries, it is tradition that the bells are rung before as well as after the wedding service. Over 12 years ago, when I was a bell ringer at Tollesbury, two members of the band married. I will always remember ringing after the service, as the bride did not immediately leave the church, but walked into the ringing chamber and grabbed a rope. We stopped ringing so she could join us.

On Saturday, 19th October, Philip, a bell ringer at All Saints Inworth, regular visitor to our Friday practice, and the youngest son of our Tower Captain Janice and her husband David, married Alex. The St. Peter's band comprised of Bernard, Cliff, David Kemsley, Duncan, Sandra, Valerie and Vanessa. On this occasion, Jim and Yvonne, bell ringers from Inworth, and George a former EACR ringer, joined them. The groom and his mother also joined the band to ring before the service. With the exception of Philip and Janice, the band of ringers ringing after the wedding service remained the same.

Our last practice night this year is on 20^{th} December and is followed by ringing on Sunday, 22^{nd} , the two Christingle Services and Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve, and the Christmas Day Family Communion Service.

On behalf of all the St. Peter's bell ringers may I wish everyone a Happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year.



Great Totham Parish Council Meetings 19th August, 23rd September and 21st October

Those familiar with children's literature may recall 'A Series of Unfortunate Events' by Lemony Snicket. While not being able to claim all events to be 'unfortunate', I have recently been overtaken by circumstances beyond my control and have thus been less efficient in bringing tidings of village matters. However, members of the Parish Council have continued to work on behalf of all our residents; the Parish Clerk has minutes of all meetings. With regard to planning matters, Maldon District Council has, in accordance with Regulation 15 of the Town and Country Planning Act, revoked five supplementary planning documents. Further information is available at www.maldon.gov.uk/spd

The August meeting was attended by Cllrs. Mrs Adams, Delderfield, Gable, Gregan, Mrs. Heaviside and Keyes. The September meeting was attended by Cllrs. Atkinson, Bass, Gable, Gregan, Mrs Heaviside, and Marshall. District Councillor Siddall was also present. The October meeting was attended by Cllrs Gable, Gregan, Mrs Heaviside and Keyes.

In August, a communication was received from County Councillor Mark Durham suggesting Parish surgeries may provide greater communication between residents and Councillors. Members felt that current provision works satisfactorily and, indeed, Cllr Siddall has already arranged surgeries at Tom's Farm Shop. Residents are also welcome to approach members directly.

The Neighbourhood Plan Open Weekend was very successful; a steady stream of residents contributed comments and suggestions which will greatly assist preparation of the Plan. Offers of assistance with the distribution of the Housing Needs Survey were also received (many have already been returned); the closing date is 6th December.

It is always pleasing to report 'a job well done' and it was noted grass cutting had been carried out very efficiently this year (it is even nicer when residents contribute unpaid service to the village). In August, the lock on the gate to Totham North Recreation Ground was vandalised; this was reported to the police and has since been repaired by Mr Cotier, who replaced the mechanism with one supplied free of charge by Tom's Farm Shop. The roundabout was refurbished by Cllr Marshall. Thank you gentlemen!

However, not everyone is as public spirited. Vandalism at the Jubilee Recreation Ground has also been reported to the police, and vehicles are still being left in the Bull Green lay-by for hours, inconveniencing other residents. Speeding, a concern highlighted in the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire, is on-going and the Speedwatch Team would welcome additional volunteers. Training is given and, with more members, an individual's contribution would not be too onerous. Please contact Cllr Atkinson if you are able to help.

An application has been submitted to the Highways Panel requesting the restoration of the walkable verge that runs adjacent to the B1022, between Beckingham Road and the Village Hall. This is a vital link between the northern and southern settlements and certain sections are in urgent need of repair. Cllr Siddall is pursuing the issues of the Five Corners junction and the possibility of a 20mph speed limit in Walden House Road. Success in any of these ventures may impact upon the Wickham Bishops initiative regarding sustainable modes of travel to school, although a popular rural school with a wide catchment area will inevitably generate access issues.

Several people asked if I would mention hedges. It has been a good growing season and greenery, often laced with brambles, is overhanging pavements and footpaths and requires pruning. Somewhat perversely, some of the new hedging along Bull Green has not thrived but, traditional hazel hedging is available to be planted in due season - courtesy of the squirrel who lives in my garden!

In October, a request was received from Great Totham Nursery in respect of a banner to publicise their services. General advertising is not considered appropriate, however the Council is pleased to support local organisations and suggested the banner could be displayed at the Village Hall for a set time at the beginning of each term. Residents are reminded that both the Hall and the United Reformed Church at Totham North will be used as polling stations on Thursday 12th December. May I just add for the benefit of WI members (or anyone wishing to join us!), our venue for the evening will be The Barn Church.

The Maldon District Heritage Winter Talks are to take place at The Friends Meeting House, Butt Lane, Maldon CM9 7HD, the first being 'Maldon's Waterfront: its culture and conservation', which included 'heritage-led regeneration. St. Stephen

(died 36 BC, Jerusalem; feast day 26 December),



St Stephen was a Christian deacon in Jerusalem and the first Christian martyr, whose apology before the Sanhedrin points to a distinct strand of belief in early Christianity. His defence of his faith before the rabbinic court enraged his Jewish audience, and he was taken out of the city and stoned to death. His final words, a prayer of forgiveness for his attackers, echo those of Jesus on the cross. Stephen is the patron saint of deacons and stonemasons. St. Stephens day is 26th December.

The Day After Christmas

As opposed to "the night before Christmas", the day after has 2 names (or 3 in Ireland). We are familiar with Good King Wenceslas looking out on the Feast of Stephen but less familiar with that name relating to the day after Christmas.

The Feast of Stephen or St Stephen's Day is a Christian saint's day celebrated on 26 December to commemorate St Stephen who was the first Christian martyr. Not much is known about Stephen's early life but it is known that he was one of Jesus' disciples. He was seen as someone having a strong mind and strong faith and was deemed to be "full of the Holy Spirit". However whilst he worked among people offering help and performing "wonders", it is not known when or how he actually became a disciple.

Following Jesus' death, many people looked on the 12 apostles for help but, being only 12 in number, they were overwhelmed by requests for help so it would appear that they enlisted disciples to help deal with the sheer numbers. These disciples numbered 7 in total and were seen as men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and full of wisdom. The chosen disciples were Stephen, Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas and Nicholas.

Stephen preached the teachings of Jesus and helped many convert to Christianity. However, as we know, not everyone was in tune with Christian teachings. This is laid out in the Bible in Acts 6:9 which reveals that the synagogue of the Libertines and the Cyrenians and the Alexandrians and people from Cilicia and Asia disputed with Stephen and his teachings. Now there is nothing new about fake news, and back then this was employed by people lying about Stephen. These lies became so convincing that they were taken as true and people started believing them. This led to anger and Stephen was brought before a council called the Sanhedrin. Here false witnesses testified against him.

Stephen was stoic in the face of the accusations and defended himself (in Acts 7:1-53). His final statement was "Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing on the right hand of God". Apparently this did not go down well with people and they grabbed hold of Stephen, dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death. This meant he became the first Christian martyr.

Many countries now celebrate 26 December as St Stephen's Day. In Ireland, it is also called the Day of the Wren following a story involving the chirping of a wren which gave away the hiding place of St Stephen on one occasion. Unfortunately for the wren, it was also captured and stoned to death!

The day after Christmas also has a secular name – **Boxing Day**. Now this is not recognition of the growing influence of on-line shopping and the hundreds of cardboard boxes that get hauled around the country nor is it a celebration of some famous punch-up! It is in fact recognition of the 'Christmas Box' and the day on which servants traditionally used to receive one from their masters. This is the most accepted definition of the name but it could also refer to charity boxes which were placed in churches on Christmas Day and opened up for distribution to the poor the next day – Boxing Day. One other thought relates to the sealed box taken on board sailing ships. This box contained money but was only opened (by a priest) on the day after Christmas if the voyage had been a success. The contents were then also given to the poor.



A defibrillator has been fitted at Great Totham Village Hall for village emergencies, donated from The Charlotte Adams Memorial Fund.

Charlotte, who died aged 23 from an undiagnosed heart condition in November 2014, spent many happy times in the Village Hall for nursery and parties and it seems fitting to place one there in her name. With support of friends and family 'Charlie's Angels', The Charlotte Adams Memorial Fund has raised over £60,000 and has recently purchased two defibrillators, the second being for her former school, Great Totham Primary. Charlotte's mother, Kate Bome, has worked at the school for almost 22 years, and has tirelessly raised funds in memory of her daughter in the last five years. Kate has recently been nominated by her school colleagues for the Inspirational Adult Award at the Chelmsford for You Awards, which could result in her switching on the Christmas lights in Chelmsford this year.

Regular heart screening sessions are paid from the fund via Cardiac Risk in the Young. 14 – 35 year olds are screened for cardiac abnormalities; a simple ECG could find an unknown problem such as muscle disorders or electrical faults of the heart. Sometimes an individual, like Charlotte, may have a cardiac abnormality without any symptoms. Every week in the UK at least 12 apparently fit and healthy young people aged 35 and under die from undiagnosed heart conditions.




