





#### **News from the Belfry**

I was sitting eating my breakfast listening to the Sunday Morning Worship programme on Essex Radio when I picked up a news item relating to the bell at Shrewsbury Cathedral. Intrigued, I investigated further to see that the Sunday Times, published on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, led with the headline: "Technology sounds death knell for bell-ringers".

The bell at Shrewsbury Catholic Cathedral was commissioned by Victorian architect Edward Welby Pugin. The bell was cast in 1856 and installed in the same year, but has not rung since 1973 when the bell-wheel became detached from its headstock, which stopped it from swinging and the clapper became immovable. Following a month long project, the bell has now been cleaned, repaired and restored by bell founders John Taylor of Loughborough, who cast the original bell. It has also been fitted with an automated ringing system which allows the bell to be tolled from a programmable key fob by Cathedral staff and clergy. In addition to the automated ringing system, a rope has also been attached so the bell may be tolled manually. Simon Adams of John Taylor quoted in the Sunday Times: "It is becoming fashionable to go electric because you can't always find someone to pull the rope."

I find it unbelievable that the market town of Shrewsbury with a population of about 23 times that of Great Totham cannot muster a small band of volunteers willing to toll a single bell! We are perhaps fortunate at St. Peter's to have a band of 14 ringers. It may be fashionable to go electric, however, in this ever increasing technological age, let us hope that the tradition of manually ringing church bells may long continue.

Our post Christmas lunch was on 26<sup>th</sup> January and once again was held at Forrester Park, who did us proud. 30 guests, including ringing friends from Tollesbury, Tolleshunt D'arcy, Maldon and Danbury, enjoyed a delicious lunch.

Our congratulations go to David Kemsley who rang the tenor at All Saints, Inworth to a quarter peal of Plain Bob Doubles on 2<sup>nd</sup> February. This was David's first quarter peal.

# Village News

#### March - A Month of (Special) Days

As with most months, many national days are observed in March, although March seems to have more than most. Of course, the month starts with St. David's Day on the 1<sup>st</sup>. He was a Welsh bishop based in Mynyw during the 6<sup>th</sup> century. He became the patron saint of Wales in the 12<sup>th</sup> century on the occasion of his canonisation by Pope Callixtus II. The date of March 1<sup>st</sup> commemorates the date of St David's death in 589AD.

However the first day in March is also National Fruit Compote Day, National Peanut Butter Lover's Day and National Pig Day. Naturally these 3 'food' days are observed in the US. Moving on, we have World Wildlife Day on 3<sup>rd</sup> March which was designated by the United Nations General Assembly in 2013 set to celebrate and raise awareness of the world's wild animals and plants. In 2020, World Wildlife Day will have the theme of 'Sustaining all life on Earth'. For the more studious, World Book Day is celebrated on 5 March. This was designated by UNESCO and is a celebration of reading observed in over 100 countries.

Women's rights celebrating women's achievements takes place every year on 8 March. This emanated from the first Women's Day organized by the Socialist Party of America back on 28 February, 1909 and expanded by the German revolutionary Clara Zetkin in 1910 (don't worry men International Men's Day is on 19 November!).

Whilst I mentioned food-related national days earlier on, we have Pi Day on 14 March although this has nothing to do with food! As most people know, Pi is a mathematical constant which determines the ratio of the circumference of a circle or its diameter and also the area of a circle to the radius. As a fraction, it is defined as 22/7. The curious thing about this fraction is that the numbers beyond the decimal point never have a repeating sequence or repetition of numbers. This is continues infinitely and has been calculated to over one trillion digits beyond its decimal point. For those with less patience just 3.14 is usually sufficient.

March also incorporates another patron saint's day, St Patrick, on 17 March. He is the patron saint of Ireland. He was a 5<sup>th</sup> century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland and St Patrick's Day was made an official Christian feast day in the early 17<sup>th</sup> century. Celebrations include attending parades and ceilidhs, wearing shamrocks and green clothing and plenty of drinking of Irish beer and whiskey.

In 2020, the official start of Spring is on 20 March which also happens to coincide with World Frog Day. Frogs are seen as important in keeping the ecosystem well-balanced so should be looked after. Again it has already been

mentioned that March is quite a literary month with World Book Day on the 5<sup>th</sup>. Well there is also World Poetry Day on 21 March. This is another day adopted by UNESCO and was inaugurated in 1999 with the aim of supporting linguistic diversity through poetic expression. Continuing with the literary theme we have Tolkien Reading Day on 25 March organised by The Tolkien Society. This has been in place since 2003 aimed at promoting the life and works of JRR Tolkien by reading favourite passages. The date is fixed as the date of the down fall of Sauron and the fall of Barad-Dur in the books.

We have missed out Mothering Sunday which will be held on 22 March this year but this is well-known. These are just some of the national days celebrated in the UK and other areas. Other world days in March include World Sleep Day (13 March); International Day of Happiness (20 March) and World Water Day (22 March). Of course, the US has many more national days of interest in the month including national Old Stuff Day (2 March); National I Want You to Be Happy Day and National Mulled Wine Day (both on 3 March!); National Frozen Food Day (6 March); National Meatball Day (9 March); National Everything You Think Is Wrong Day (so don't go making decisions on 15 March); although this is closely followed by National Everything You Do Is Right Day (16 March).

# Message from the District Councillor

You may have read the publicity about the Council's proposals for the wharf charges at the Hythe for barge operators and owners. To me, barges and Maldon are completely linked. If you think of Maldon, you think barges. They are a crucial part of the town's history and heritage. They are a tremendous tourist attraction and bring visitors and resources to the district



When the item was discussed at the Strategy and Resources Committee, I ensured that a reasoned argument was put and that we needed to support the barges and their owners. A motion to increase the fees by 10% for this year only was then created. The next step is for us to meet with the barge owners to discuss and agree how we work with them on the charges in future years. We cannot lose our unique maritime heritage and what they mean to Maldon.

As a result of the findings from the Great Totham Neighbourhood Plan, the issues of getting a bus to Broomfield Hospital were raised. With the help of the Neighbourhood Plan team, who did some great investigation, we identified the Dengie Dart bus service. This is a combination of bus and taxi services and operates across the south of the district, with the aim of getting people to the hospital. We have explored it further and it looks like there is the potential to introduce something similar in the north of the district. This would be extremely useful in places like Braxted, Little Totham and Tolleshunt Major, where there are no bus services at all

We need to ensure that the most rural parts of the north of district have good infrastructure.

The next District Council Surgery will be held on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> March at 11am, at the Forget Me Not Tea Room, Tom's Farm Shop.





#### **Great Totham Parish Council Meeting held on 13<sup>th</sup> January**

The January meeting was attended by Cllrs. Mrs Adams, Atkinson, Delderfield, Gable, Gregan, Mrs. Heaviside, Keyes and Marshall. No members of the public were present.

I thought it would be appropriate to begin with an advanced notification. The Parish Clean Up Day will take place on Sunday, 5<sup>th</sup> April. The gathering points are The Compasses, Totham North and The Village Hall, Totham South. If you arrive by 2.30pm, high-viz jackets, litter pickers and sacks will await you and provision will be made to dispose of any litter you find. However, many people like to choose their own time and, whether on that day or at any time during the day, or indeed throughout the year, your contribution to the upkeep of the village is appreciated.

Sadly, what is not appreciated is the number of motorists continuing to speed through the village, particularly along the B1022 where 45 offenders were captured in December by the Tru Cam patrol. This was in addition to those recorded by the Speedwatch team, whose members are currently exploring possibilities for improving signage in the hope the situation can be improved. It may be, of course, that people breaking the speed limit are only 'passing through', however, I suspect it is also 'locals' travelling too fast who are cutting up verges around the village. There is ample room to access and exit the Village Hall car park but, recently, the soil has been churned up on either side. The corner of Totham Hill Green has also been ruined again, which is very dispiriting for those who tend it. One of the public spirited volunteers, an erstwhile driver for Stan's Coaches, regularly drove large vehicles along Totham Hill Green and into Beckingham Road without the need to leave the carriageway!

Councillor Atkinson and Councillor Marshall have been busy undertaking maintenance around the village and will continue to be so. Three seats need attention, and hawthorn and hazel shrubs will be planted to thicken the 'new' hedge on Bull green. It was noted that the green had not been secured after recent grass cutting and this will be attended to. At Totham North, the phone box is seriously in need of refurbishment, for which quotes have been sought; Parish notice boards will also be renovated.

Subsequent to the last meeting, Councillors received notification of a new textile recycling scheme. It is stressed that this is not in competition

with donations currently made to charity shops, but a complementary system provided for those who are unable to deliver items themselves. Maldon District Council, in partnership with Essex Textiles, is to provide a clothing and textile kerbside collection, and this began in February. Blue recycling sacks have been distributed to every household and donations will be collected on your scheduled recycling day. Further information may be obtained by visiting www.essextextiles.co.uk, and direct contact with Essex Textiles made by phoning 0800 787 9071 or e-mailing info@essextextiles.co.uk.
