


THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

'Seek those things which are above'



Like a young plant that defiantly emerges from winter's cold earth, the first Easter Day was the sure sign that a new chapter had begun in the human quest for God. The resurrection of Jesus Christ gives us hope that all may rise from spiritual darkness into a new relationship with God, 'seeking' – as today's Collect puts it – 'those things which are above' – the coming of his Kingdom on earth as in heaven.

THE GREETING

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

if we are faithless,
he remains faithful.

PENITENCE

In a moment of quiet reflection, let us honestly examine our lives, remembering where our attitudes have been wrong, where love has grown cold, where hurts have not been forgiven, or where cries for help have not been answered ...

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.

**Most merciful God,
Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
we confess that we have sinned
in thought, word and deed.
We have not loved you with our whole
heart.
We have not loved our neighbours as
ourselves.
In your mercy
forgive what we have been,
help us to amend what we are,
and direct what we shall be;
that we may do justly,
love mercy,
and walk humbly with you, our God.**
Amen.

May Almighty God have mercy on us,
forgive us our sins
and bring us to everlasting life,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

Let us pray ... (silent prayer)

Almighty God,
whose Son Jesus Christ
Is the resurrection and the life:
raise us, who trust in him,
from the death of sin
to the life of righteousness,
that we may seek those things which are
above, where he reigns with you
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Praise to you, O Christ.

THE SERMON

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Let us declare our faith in the resurrection of
our Lord Jesus Christ:

(Special thanksgivings and prayers ...)

Our Father in heaven, we pray for all people,
in the name of your Son Jesus Christ:

We pray for the Church, for bishop N., and
for all who lead, teach and minister in
Christ's name ... Grant that we may be
nourished in our faith and understanding,
and bear daily witness to Christ's love.
Lord of life, **in your mercy, hear us.**

We pray for the nations of the world and for
those who take authority to serve the cause
of justice and human well-being ...
Strengthen our Queen and the leaders of the
nations with gifts of wisdom, courage and
integrity, that your will may be done on earth
as it is in heaven.
Lord of life, **in your mercy, hear us.**

We pray for those who are afflicted by
natural disasters, or caught up in brutal
conflicts ...
Fill them with the resurrection hope that
good will prevail, and bless all who stand
with them in finding solutions to their
difficulties.
Lord of life, **in your mercy, hear us.**

**Christ died for our sins
in accordance with the Scriptures;**

**he was buried; he was raised to life on
the third day
in accordance with the Scriptures;**

**afterwards he appeared to his followers,
and to all the apostles:**

**this we have received,
and this we believe.** (1 Cor. 15:3-7)

This is the faith of the Church:
**This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.**

We remember with thanksgiving those who
have died ... Strengthen all who mourn, with
the sure hope that, in Christ, their loved ones
are raised to fullness of life.
Lord of life, **in your mercy, hear us.**

**Accept all these prayers
for the sake of your Son
our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.**
