Rev's Ramblings Thursday 16th July 2020



Last Saturday we walked from our house across the fields into Pelsall, enjoying the nice weather. The fields we pass through have had different crops in them over the years, but this year we though they were looking particularly dead and scruffy. However, on looking closer at what we thought were overgrown weeds, we realised that this was a

crop of oilseed rape waiting for harvesting.

Oilseed rape is that beautifully bright yellow crop that has become more common over the last 10 years or so, but to get the oil from the seeds the plants actually have to go black and dry. Once that happens, the seeds are crushed into a lovely light yellow cooking oil.

Don't you think that's what life can be like? The seeds are planted, the plants grow and flourish into beautiful vibrancy and life, then begin to die down and become a little dry. Certainly as we get older the vibrancy seems to seep from our lives, but that is the time to take up new pursuits and hobbies to reinvigorate ourselves.

It's the same with our faith, as well. We hear the Word, we believe, we flourish – but, if we aren't careful, when we get to the seed ripening stage we can begin to dry out and shrivel as Christians. That's why we need to keep reading our Bibles, listening to different speakers on-line or on DVDs or CDs, playing Christian music that we may not normally listen to. By keeping our faith fresh, the oil of God's love will flow from us and, no matter how old or young we are, we will continue to flourish both within ourselves and as witnesses to those around us.
