CHURCH SERVICES AFTER LOCKDOWN 2

We will be collecting TOYS which the Salvation Army will give out to children from poor families at Christmas. These can be for boys or girls, 0-18 years old and must be unwrapped. Please bring your toys to the service or drop off at church any time from 9.30-11.30am on Sunday 6th December. Once the service is over they will be taken away by the Salvation Army.


