### A Reading from the New Testament

Revelation 3 v 15 - end

‘I know your deeds; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish that you were either one or the other! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth. For you say, “I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing.” You do not realize that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. Therefore I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire so that you may be rich; and white robes to clothe you and to keep the shame of your nakedness from being seen; and salve to anoint your eyes so that you may see. I reprove and discipline those whom I love. Be earnest, therefore, and repent. Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me. To the one who conquers I will give a place with me on my throne, he who has an ear, let them hear what the Spirit is saying to the churches.’

### GOSPEL READING

Matthew 25 v 31 - 32

‘When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his throne in heavenly glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.’

## **Thought for the Day**

If there was one subject at school I not only hated but was useless at, it was chemistry! However, the one experiment I remember was one we have no doubt all done at some stage in our education, the 'Litmus' test.

With little strips of litmus paper, one could evaluate the liquids held in the test tubes to see whether they leaned towards an acid (red) or an alkaline solution (blue). All straightforward stuff, even I couldn't mess this up, however, there were also the solutions that gave no clear result, neither extreme acid nor alkaline, they sat in the middle, a so called 'neutral.'

Although happy to have turned my back on chemistry, I cannot help but think how the 'litmus' test resembles our reading from the Book of Revelation.

The reading tells us God sees us as we are, not a good thing for some of us when the day of judgment or separation comes. What will god be looking for?

What will distinguish us from each other?

What will save us -

Doctrinal soundness?

Faith that can move a mountain?

Regular Church Attendance?

How much we put in the collection plate?

I rather hope none of the above! What the reading implies in the book of Revelation is that we must become a people who welcome God into our lives, our hearts, our thinking and importantly our actions towards each other and God.

If we are passionate disciples of Jesus, we have no need to worry and although it grieves me to say this, those who do not believe there is a God and reject Jesus wouldn't care what the Spirit has to say anyway! This reading is primarily aimed at those in life who sit in the middle, those who are neither hot or cold towards God.

One thing for sure about the litmus test was that it revealed the exact nature of the solution being tested, substances may look alike but they can be completely different. Human-beings, regardless of whether they come to church or not may look alike too but how they act reveals a great deal about their Christian character.

What goes on deeply within us concerns God, how we respond to the needs of the world or each other matters, indifference is not a Kingdom quality.

Christian discipleship truly begins when we invite Jesus into our lives. Only when we look at the world through his eyes will we begin to understand just how blind we may have become both to the needs of the world and to our own faults.

Our relationship with Jesus matters, ultimately we cannot evade or tone down the reality that one day God will be our judge but what matters more than anything is that Jesus is our Saviour. When Jesus shares our lives we will share his eternity.

THINK GOD, KNOW JESUS, LISTEN TO HIS SPIRIT  
AND ALL WILL GO WELL WITH YOU.
