NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

1. Sale of surplus land for housing, adjoining St Michael and All Angels, Foulridge, jointly with land owned by the Diocese of Blackburn and land owned by Mrs C Tinniswood.
2. Re-ordering of church driveway, necessary to allow permanent access to the housing development and to meet Local Authority Planning Permission requirements.
3. Movement of "Preaching Cross" monument from the current car-park area to a new position to the east of the main church building, necessary to allow the re-ordering of the driveway and re-positioning of church car-parking spaces.

so that your letter reaches the registrar not later than 26/02/2021. A letter of objection must include your name and address and state whether you live in the parish and/or your name is entered on the church electoral roll of the parish or any other basis on which you have an interest in the matter.

Directions to petitioner

You must display this public notice (or a copy of it) for a continuous period of not less than 28 days, not counting the day on which it was put up or the day on which it is taken down, (or for such other period as the Court may direct and subject to any special directions of the registrar) in each of the following places:

1. on a notice board or in some other prominent position inside the church; and
2. on a notice board outside the church or in some other prominent position (whether on the outside of the church door or elsewhere) so that it can be read by the public.
