## **Nicola writes**

Hello friends,

I began Lent 2020 in Rome; sitting in St Peter's Square listening to the Pope speak. He spoke of the desert as a place not only of death but of one where life grows, we need time in the desert to centre our lives on the things of God, the things which matter. Over the past year there has been growth and God has moved in ways we never anticipated. Lent can be a time for spiritual growth.

Lent is traditionally a season of 40 days of penitence and fasting...one where we often think of giving something up. Now I'm not sure how you feel about giving something up for Lent this year, but I feel as though I have done nothing but give things up for the past year. I've given up hugs, holidays, meals and coffee catch-ups with friends, weddings, singing and for a while going to church each week... the list goes on; but I don't need to carry on with that list because we've all done exactly that – we've given up things we love, things we enjoy, because we love and care for each other. So, the idea of giving anything else up just makes me feel sad...I realise I need some of those things which make me smile even more than ever before.

Maybe instead of giving something up like chocolate, biscuits etc, maybe we need to shift our thoughts. What if we think of Lent as a time when we turn away from the things that distract us from God's love; and turn towards the things that reconnect us with God's love? **Give up the negativity and take on board God's positivity.**

Here are a few ideas which might help you get started:

### **GET OUT**

The nights are slowly getting lighter and signs of spring are showing; the snowdrops are flowering and the daffodil buds are ready to burst. So, spend a bit of time outside every day if you can- even if it's just a few minutes- listen to the birdsong, breathe in God's peace and breathe out those stresses and **give up your worries to God**. Doodle in a notebook or write in a journal the things you see which you are thankful of; take some photos of the beauty of the world around us. Create a Lent filled with thankfulness as we appreciate God's goodness.

### **GET THE KETTLE ON AND RECONNECT**

Most of us take a tea or coffee break during the day so why not use that time to pick up the phone and give someone a call who you haven't spoken to for a while. Or why not write a letter, send an encouraging email or pop a card in the post. **Give up waiting for someone to get in touch with you....** make the first move, make a difference and help someone smile.

### **GET A BIT OF PEACE AND QUIET...**

If you are not already in the habit of praying, **give up making excuses not to pray**. As you wake up say this one simple prayer.... Lord, help me see you in each moment of the day, and don't let me forget that you are with me whatever the day brings. Find the same time each day to find a quiet spot,



light a candle, and just spend five minutes quietly. It doesn't have to be complicated. Say the Lord's prayer. Just 'be' with God ...no distractions. Check out the daily prayers shared on Facebook or in the prayer diary.

As we enter the season of Lent, we desire to follow Jesus, to grow in discipleship and in faith. It is not just personal sins we repent of, but also a recognition that being human means to be imperfect.

This Lent, be kind to yourself, take things gently, remember that God's love is all around you. And whatever you do, **don't just give up**. As

signs of new life begin in the world around us, and then we will reach Easter with a fresh hope and joy and never losing sight that God's love for us is bigger than everything.

## ***Please pray for our link parishes in Namibia:***

Please pray for the family of Mr. Jesaja Shigwedha - Chairperson of the School Board at Onangholo School, Okathitu who has died from Coronavirus.

There is concern that virus numbers are on the increase in Namibia and many people have lost their jobs due to the pandemic which is causing severe hardship. The country has only been able to order enough vaccination for 10% of the population. The vaccines should have been received in January but to date they have not yet been received by the country.

Additionally, despite it being the rainy season Okathitu and Ruacana have had little rain and the crops which have been planted have died. Please pray for rain so that there can be a good harvest this year to ease the already difficult situation which the pandemic is causing.






## Team Rector Update






*In the event that during the period specified for attendance at worship the church has been closed for public worship and has not provided alternative premises for that worship, **the requirements of these admissions arrangements in relation to attendance will only apply to the period when the church or alternative premises have been available for worship.***

### **Canon Slade School have said:**

*"We will not be asking churches to record the attendance of children and young people at worship services for the purposes of supporting future applications to Canon Slade School until all churches are fully open."*

## This Week's Prayer and Readings

---

### **The Sunday before Lent**

*(Readings from The New International Version)*

#### **Collect (This week's prayer)**

Holy God, you know the disorder of our sinful lives: set straight our crooked hearts, and bend our wills to love your goodness and your glory in Jesus Christ our Lord.

#### **2Kings2:1-12 'Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit'**

When the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven in a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. <sup>2</sup> Elijah said to Elisha, 'Stay here; the Lord has sent me to Bethel.'

But Elisha said, 'As surely as the Lord lives and as you live, I will not leave you.' So they went down to Bethel.

<sup>3</sup> The company of the prophets at Bethel came out to Elisha and asked, 'Do you know that the Lord is going to take your master from you today?'

'Yes, I know,' Elisha replied, 'so be quiet.'

<sup>4</sup> Then Elijah said to him, 'Stay here, Elisha; the Lord has sent me to Jericho.'

And he replied, 'As surely as the Lord lives and as you live, I will not leave you.' So they went to Jericho.

<sup>5</sup> The company of the prophets at Jericho went up to Elisha and asked him, 'Do you know that the Lord is going to take your master from you today?'

'Yes, I know,' he replied, 'so be quiet.'

<sup>6</sup> Then Elijah said to him, 'Stay here; the Lord has sent me to the Jordan.'

And he replied, 'As surely as the Lord lives and as you live, I will not leave you.' So the two of them walked on.

<sup>7</sup> Fifty men from the company of the prophets went and stood at a distance, facing the place where Elijah and Elisha had stopped at the Jordan. <sup>8</sup> Elijah took his cloak, rolled it up and struck the water with it. The water divided to the right and to the left, and the two of them crossed over on dry ground.

<sup>9</sup> When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, 'Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?'

'Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit,' Elisha replied.

<sup>10</sup> 'You have asked a difficult thing,' Elijah said, 'yet if you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours – otherwise, it will not.'

<sup>11</sup> As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. <sup>12</sup> Elisha saw this and cried out, 'My father! My father! The chariots and horsemen of Israel!' And Elisha saw him no more. Then he took hold of his garment and tore it in two.

### ***Psalm 50:1-6 "The Mighty One, God, the Lord, speaks and summons the earth"***

A psalm of Asaph.

<sup>1</sup> The Mighty One, God, the Lord, speaks and summons the earth  
from the rising of the sun to where it sets.

<sup>2</sup> From Zion, perfect in beauty, God shines forth.

<sup>3</sup> Our God comes and will not be silent;

a fire devours before him, and around him a tempest rages.

<sup>4</sup> He summons the heavens above, and the earth, that he may judge his people:

<sup>5</sup> 'Gather to me this consecrated people, who made a covenant with me by sacrifice.'

<sup>6</sup> And the heavens proclaim his righteousness, for he is a God of justice.

### ***2Corinthians 4:3-6 "God... made his light shine in our hearts"***

<sup>3</sup> And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. <sup>4</sup> The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. <sup>5</sup> For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. <sup>6</sup> For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ.

### ***Mark 9:2-9 "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"***

<sup>2</sup> After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. <sup>3</sup> His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. <sup>4</sup> And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

<sup>5</sup> Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters – one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' <sup>6</sup> (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.)

<sup>7</sup> Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: 'This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!'

<sup>8</sup> Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.

<sup>9</sup> As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. <sup>10</sup> They kept the matter to themselves, discussing what 'rising from the dead' meant.
