This coming Thursday, 'Thy Kingdom Come' begins. It's a global prayer movement, which the Archbishop of Canterbury has invited people from all around the world to

join. Since it started in May 2016, Christians from 172 countries have taken part, praying 'Come Holy Spirit', so that friends and family, neighbours and colleagues might come to know Jesus Christ. It runs between Ascension day and Pentecost.
