

SCIENTISTS have dated some of Britain's oldest stained-glass works of art in [Canterbury Cathedral](#), England's most important ecclesiastical building. Their tests show that figures portraying four ancestors of Christ have been in the cathedral since the first half of the C12. They originally formed part of a series of about 40, most of which were destroyed in a fire in 1174. The panels have six different colours but there were no natural sources of cobalt available to European glass-makers in Norman times so amazingly the blue glass was probably made of re-melted ancient Roman glass, manufactured about 1000 years earlier! The Romans may have sourced their cobalt from mines in the Balkans or the Middle East, and the soda they used as a flux came from salt lakes in northern Egypt.
