¹ The revelation from Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servants what must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, ² who testifies to everything he saw – that is, the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ. ³ Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near.

⁴ John,
To the seven churches in the province of Asia:

Grace and peace to you from him who is, and who was, and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne, ⁵ and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth.

Revelation 1:3 NIV

For the World and our Nation and our City

Holy One, we have so many prayers on our hearts, sometimes it is hard to know where to begin.

- **Afghanistan** – Pray for its people, that they may have peace and come to know God's salvation.
- **Migrants** – Pray for people fleeing their homeland leaving everything behind; pray for those in power, that God will give them mercy, compassion and wisdom as they deal with each situation.
- **COVID pandemic** – Pray for those suffering the effects, for those without vaccine supplies, for medical staff, for anxious parents, and wisdom for governments in making the best decisions.

For St Jude's Church

- **Reflect on Revelation 1-11.** *Look at vs.1-3:* God gave Jesus a message. What is the sequence that brings that very message to us today? What are we promised if we take this message to heart? What event do you think is 'very near' (v.3)? *Look at vs.4-8:* Revelation is written in 'Apocalyptic' language, symbolic language to powerfully communicate truths about God. In v.4 we find an example of it "the seven spirits before the throne of God." Seven represents completeness or perfection. The "seven spirits" is the Spirit of God who is always present and ever seeing. What greeting is offered from God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), and what does this promise? What comparisons are made between God (and his gospel of peace) and the rulers of the world (the mighty Roman Empire at the time John wrote)? What has God done for those who love him (vs.5-6)? What will become of those who reject Jesus (v.7)? What guarantees this will happen (v.8)? *Look at vs.9-11:* What does John, and the churches he is writing to, face (v.9)? Given what we know about the number 7, what is the significance of the churches listed in v.11? Key themes in Revelation are: suffering, kingdom, and patient endurance. What encouragement do you find in these verses to patiently endure suffering for the sake of the kingdom of God? Pray for confidence to trust in Jesus' rule (and in his gospel of peace), even when people who ignore him thrive, the church in the west is dwindling, and so much of the world is in chaos.
- **School Assemblies** Pray for Phil as he takes his first assembly of the new academic year at St Andrew's School on Monday with years 4 to 6. The theme given is "Count your blessings" and Luke 8:2-25.
- **John Welsby** Pray for John standing for election to General Synod (see News for details).
- **Those you know suffering in Body or Spirit** Pray for them and for wisdom how to best help them.
