*How can you show your response to God's presence in your life and how can you demonstrate your stewardship of His creation?*

Over the last few years, we have used our Harvest to review and recommit ourselves to our level of giving to the Church. How much we give will vary from individual to individual; for some this amount may need to decrease as their available funds and income declines or becomes more stretched; while for others our income increases, and we often forget to review our level of giving to the Church.

The costs of running the Church – and providing all the services and activities etc – rises year on year – just like your household costs. So, if your 'fuel' bills have risen ... so have the Churches. Likewise, as the economy struggles and affect us – so it affects the life of the Church.

We have been overwhelmed by the generous response we have experienced through the last 18 months of COVID and want to thank everyone for all they have done to support the life of our churches and the work we do in our communities.

The last months have highlighted how we rely mainly on your personal giving to meet these costs so ask that you will find some time and space this Harvest to again review your level of giving and the way in which you do it. Or if you are not already a member of the 'envelope' or Parish Giving scheme– you might consider joining it.

***How can I be a wise steward of my God given gifts?***

- **Think about the things you value in your life and the things you regularly spend your money on.**
- **Think about how God has provided you with that and so much more – life itself – out of His love for you.**
- **Reflect on how much money – out of your love for Him – you can offer to support His Church.**

**Complete the response form and place it in a sealed envelope and when you come to Church for Harvest – as well as bringing your gifts to share with those in need come to the Altar and make your response to God.**

For some any increase (or decrease) may be significant, for others it may be 20p or 50p a week (*But even if the average increase was 50p a week from everyone regularly attending on a Sunday then the total increase for the Parish would be over £4000 a year which would help reduce the shortfall we face each year.*)

Whatever your response is it is important and valued (remember the widow's mite!) and we wish to thank you for giving this process your time and consideration.

**You can help the Parish of St Mary's and its 3 Churches in a number of ways:**

- ✓ **By using the weekly 'envelope' scheme** – you will be given a set of envelopes for the year – so making it possible for you to 'set aside' a sum of money each week, whether you are at Church or not.
- ✓ **By joining the Parish Giving Scheme** – your giving is done via the bank and the scheme automatically claims the Gift Aid and pays it to the Parish on a monthly basis. This also saves bank charges for the Parish and cuts down on the work for the Treasurer and others in the Parish.
- ✓ **Or give by a monthly standing order through your bank account.** These saves finding the right cash for the weekly envelope, as well as the cost of the envelopes and the time taken to count and bank the cash every week. This has been invaluable during COVID
- ✓ If you are a tax-payer, **make a Gift Aid declaration** (if you haven't already done so), as the church can reclaim an extra 25% from the taxman. For example, for every £10 you give we can claim a further £2.50 in addition from the Government.
- ✓ Consider making a **'bequest'** to the Parish in your will
