Opportunities for worship this Sunday

St John's will be open today, Sunday 10th October 2021 at 10am, for a Harvest Family Communion Service. We will be supporting St Catherine's Food Bank at our Harvest Service. There will be a retiring collection for the food bank at the service and at all the services in October. You can also donate to St Catherine's Food Bank by bank transfer. The Sort code is: 050962 and the Account Number is: 72232656. If you would prefer to bring food or toiletries to our Harvest Service, we will make sure that this reaches St Catherine's.

We ask everyone to wear a face covering while they are in church. This can be a mask or a visor/face shield. Do bring one with you, if possible. We are pleased to announce that we will be singing hymns in the service and there will also be the opportunity to light a candle in the side chapel. Printed service booklets and hymn books will be available, and we will no longer have the one-way system in place. Other aspects of worship – such as the way in which we receive communion – will not change for the time being. All will be made clear in the service.

Giving to St John's

If you feel able to give, you can support St John's financially in the following ways:

The Parish Giving Scheme – This is like a standing order, but the regular payments from your bank account go to PGS, who pass it on to the church. For taxpayers, they also recover the Gift Aid, so it reduces our admin and improves our cashflow.

A further advantage of the PGS is that you can opt to have your regular gift increased annually in line with inflation, which can help it keep up with increasing costs without having to keep changing your standing order, calculating an annual top-up or putting an extra coin in your envelope every week.

Gift Aid Envelopes - If you give using weekly or monthly envelopes, you can save up your envelopes until you are able to come back to church, or send Geoff a cheque made out to "St John's Church, Wakefield, PCC". A Message from Bishop Tony about a climate rally on Friday 15th October

A group of climate activists from Spain, marching to Glasgow for the COP26 climate summit will be coming through Wakefield on **Friday 15th October**.

They will be arriving at Wakefield Cathedral at around **12 noon** when there will be a brief rally outside on the Cathedral Steps. If you would like to show your support, please do come along.

The marchers will be walking from Mapplewell along the A61 Barnsley Road, past Newmillerdam and St Thomas a Beckett's secondary school. If you live in that area, you could go out to cheer them on and/or walk along with them to the town centre.

After lunch - probably around 2pm - the marchers will continue on the A61 Leeds Road through Outwood, passing the famous Rhubarb fields and aiming to arrive in Leeds around 6pm.
