This Sunday's reading (Luke 3.15-17, 21-22), one of the first Sunday readings in the New Year, is about the Baptism of Jesus. It not only encourages us both to think about our baptisms but also reminds us that Jesus is God, Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us. It also encourages us to open ourselves up to God changing us into the people he created us to be. At its deepest level baptism is about new birth, our starting afresh, our being born again.
