Statement From Roger Bearman & James Hawkes and a Letter from Revd Dan Pierce

Sunday 23rd October 2022

This statement is from James Hawkes and Roger Bearman, Chairs of LL/GL & LW PCC & GW with Ford End PCC

This week we received an email from the Bishop's Office that referred to the Rev Dan's new duties, licensed as Priest in Charge of our Parishes, whilst remaining as Lead Minister for St. Francis Community Church. As you may imagine this came as a surprise to all those who have been involved with the appointment process as this had not been discussed at his interview or at any subsequent

We immediately replied asking for clarification of his position and to be perfectly blunt we have received a reply which is disingenuous and has not given us the clarification we were looking for. Consequently, we have requested a meeting with Bishop John.

This miscommunication from the hierarchy in the Diocese should not distract us from the essence of Dan joining us as a much loved and respected leader. We are confident that he will work well within our Parishes. He will bring fresh ideas to reach out to worshipping and non-worshipping community, supported by our lay leaders and other clergy from the NCMMP group.

Meanwhile, we will pursue our enquires with the Bishop to establish Dan's exact terms of reference in our Parishes particularly how his time will be divided, the financial implications of linking up with St Francis and for our 2023 Parish Share commitments.

I need to acknowledge the considerable confusion, disappointment and frustration that has accompanied the realisation that I will continue to have responsibility for St Francis alongside my new role

I'm not quite clear yet how we have come to the state of affairs in which we find ourselves. Can I first apologise and express my irritation that I may have contributed to it.


There are things I could say (and will say face to face) that may bring clarity and excitement about our potential future together although it is evident that mistakes have been made somewhere along the

I would like to lend a note of hope in this regrettable situation. I have nursed what I believe to be a calling to work with you since February. It's really surprised and delighted me. We have had an excruciatingly long wait to enter the "process" and be appointed so I am, like everyone else, very upset to think that this has been somehow under false pretences.

I don't want to diminish what has been a spectacular system failure but there remains an opportunity here to forge a way of working that will bring life and love both to our existing parishes and to all the housing that will continue to spring up among us. My view is that St Francis will bring more than it takes from this endeavour (not excluding financial contribution). However, I admit that without proper explanation this potential may be difficult to conceive at present. I hope I can get an opportunity to express why and how St Francis and the villages collaborating can have consolidated longterm benefits for us all as "one body with many parts" (to quote St Paul).

Until such a time please accept my apologies for any way I may have contributed to the present difficulties. It is not a good way to start and I hope it doesn't derail us before we even begin. I trust we will find an agreeable way forward with our Bishop and Archdeacon Mike. More than that though I pray aloud today the salutation from the end of the book of Hebrews.

"Now may the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, equip you [us] with everything good for doing his will, and may he work in us what is pleasing to him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen." Yours in Christ, Dan
