

The Four Gospels

Session 1: Why, how and when did the Gospels emerge. What is a Gospel and why are there four?

Session 2: When and how did the Gospel manuscripts appear? How reliable are they? On what grounds were the four gospels included in the canon of Scripture.?

Session 3: What is the relationship between the four Gospels. What is the structure, content and theology of Mark's Gospel?

Session 4: What is the structure, content and theology of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke?

Session 5: What is the structure, content and theology of John's Gospel?

Session 6: What, in the light of our explorations, is the purpose of the Gospels? Are the Gospels reliable? How should we read them?

This is a six session course that opens the doors on the often hidden work of biblical scholarship but also helps to renew our confidence in our faith and to refresh our inner life with God.
