The poor of the world . . .

Not long before his death Jesus reminded his friends that the poor will always be here - his point was to remind them that his life on earth was coming to an end, but it reminds us that poverty is as present in our world as it was in his.

It seems to be an impossible problem to crack. This winter has been particularly hard. The cost of living crisis has hit us all hard, but if you were already struggling it has been potentially disastrous. It is easy to think that Norfolk is a wealthy area but the Norwich Foodbank figures for December show an increase of 46% in the number of people who turned to them for help. This is a frightening number particularly when you consider that these are people in crisis. The Foodbank is there to tide people over and to direct them to find help, but recently it seems that help is increasingly hard to find. In February The Joseph Rowntree Foundation produced a report into the cost of living that found that in order to afford the essentials, a single person needs £120 a week but they are only eligible for £80 in benefits which leaves a weekly shortfall of £40.

Obtaining benefits is neither straightforward nor instant. There is a five-week waiting period for the first payment and although the government offer loans to cover this period, we know at least 49% of people are already in debt to the government when their first payment arrives. It feels like a desperate cycle of poverty, but I believe there is hope and it is something we can all support.

At the end of last year, I spent some time working with the team at Great Yarmouth Minster in their outreach project 'Pathways'. This is a social cafe in an old church hall, near the docks which offers a free hot meal, three times a week to those who need it. The customers are a mix of the lonely, the homeless and those living in hostels. They are grateful for the warmth and good food, especially in the winter months. A support worker is always in attendance to provide advice and help with applications for benefits and housing.



The project also operates as a Trussell Trust Foodbank distribution hub once a week and distributes food from the Fareshare project. Fareshare is a way in which food, mainly from supermarkets that has been over stocked or is approaching or past its sell by date, can be re-distributed to people who can make good use of it. Without Fareshare this food would be written off and sent to landfill, but instead it reaches those in need.

I wasn't sure what to expect in Yarmouth, but what I found was not despair. I found love and hope. The project is staffed almost entirely by volunteers who greet the customers with respect and affection. They serve the food, wash up or just chat to the guests making it clear that there is no judgement. Listening to their stories it is easy to see how any of us could be in their shoes, it doesn't take much - job loss, illness, addiction - but we can all help to make a difference to the lives of others. Pathways is just one project, there are many like it who are happy to welcome new volunteers and receive support in terms of gifts of food or money. The poor of the world may always be with us, but we can ease the burden with generosity and love.

New Dean of Norwich



Revd Canon Dr Andrew Braddock, aged 51, is the 40th Dean of Norwich after Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II approved the appointment. Canon Andrew, the Interim Dean of Gloucester, officially began his new role at the helm of Norwich Cathedral following a special service at the Cathedral on Saturday 28 January.

He was ordained in Norwich Cathedral in 1998 and it is a welcome return to Norfolk for Canon Andrew who spent his first ten years of public ministry in the Diocese.

Canon Andrew's appointment follows the retirement of the Very Revd Jane Hedges, the 39th Dean of Norwich, in May 2022. He is married to Victoria and they have two teenage children.

Writing competition for children and young people aged between 4 and 18 years old launched for the 650th anniversary of Julian of Norwich

To celebrate the 650th anniversary of the first woman known to write a book in English, a special writing competition is being launched - and it needs YOU! It's free to enter and entrants are asked to submit beautifully composed prose or poetry up to a maximum of 500 words on the theme "Divine Love". The theme takes its name from the publication by Julian of Norwich, whose Revelations of Divine Love tells the story of her experiences in May 1373 and the wonderful conclusions she drew from them. Following the sixteen visions which Julian received, she took up residence at St Julian's Church in Norwich.

The winner will receive £100 worth of book vouchers, the runner-up £50 worth of book vouchers, and any honourable mentions £30 worth of book vouchers. There will also be a whole host of other goodies up for grabs - including prizes from Norwich's independent bookshop Bookbugs and Dragon Tales and the National Centre for Writing - which will be announced in the EDP.

How to enter - Interpreting the theme "Divine Love", 4 to 18 year olds can submit one piece of work - either fiction, nonfiction, or poetry - up to a maximum of 500 words. Google Docs will be used to check the word count, and titles will not be included.

Ideally, entrants will have taken inspiration from Julian of Norwich and reflect on teachings, learning, and advice. Collaborations will not be accepted, and the work must be the author's own.

Participants retain the rights to their submissions. Entries must be written in English. Participation is open to anyone who lives in Norfolk, or has links with the county, and fits within the age criteria.

The deadline for entries is 5 pm on Sunday 30th April. Submissions must be emailed to:



Rockland St Mary Benefice Update

April and May bring us Spring in its fullness, with longer days, hopefully warmer weather and signs of new life in our gardens and the fields and waterways around us. It's also a time when we turn again from darkness to light, from Christ's Passion to his Resurrection in Holy Week and Easter.

What's on in Holy Week and Easter in Rockland Benefice, April 2nd - 9th:

- Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday (April 2nd). As we recall Jesus' entry to Jerusalem in triumph, before his arrest and trial, we carry our palm crosses and enter more deeply into his coming passion at our services in Claxton (9.30am) and Surlingham (11am)
- ❖ For the following three evenings we will hold Night Prayer online at 8pm from the Barn. This short, simple but moving service will include a time of quiet reflection.
- ❖ At the Paschal Meal in the Barn on Maundy Thursday (April 6th 6.30 pm) we recall the Last Supper through food and words drawn from Jewish Passover traditions and Christian Communion. There is a small charge of £8.50 towards the cost of the meal. Please contact Nick or Helen if you wish to attend (01508) 538014.
- Good Friday's Family Worship at Surlingham, (April 7th, 10am) is an all-age opportunity to hear and respond to the story of Jesus' crucifixion. At 2pm Still with the Cross in the Barn, will be a time of music, words and reflection on the cross and all it means for us.
- Holy Saturday (April 8th) marks the beginning of the Easter celebrations with the Lighting of the New Fire at Rockland St. Mary at 7.30pm. This candlelit service welcomes back the light of Christ, and in his light we have an opportunity to renew our baptism vows.
- On Easter morning (April 9th) we welcome Easter dawn at the Sunrise Service on Rockland Staithe at 6 am. Communion will be celebrated at Claxton and Kirby Bedon at 9.30 am, 11am Family Worship at Carleton St. Peter and 3.30 pm Easter Hymns and Readings at Bramerton and Surlingham.

We hope that you will be able join in this spiritual journey that we make towards the pain of the cross and joy of the empty tomb that lies beyond it.

This year's Rockland Benefice Annual Meeting takes place on Wednesday April 26th at The Barn at Rockland Rectory, beginning at 7.30 pm. Please come along as we review the past year, elect members to our church councils and look forward to the future, plus cheese and wine!

Coronation Celebrations Sunday May 7th - On the first weekend in May we join with the rest of the country in celebrating King Charles's and Queen Camilla's coronation. As a benefice we're gathering in thanksgiving for a special Communion service on Sunday May 7th at 11am, which will include some coronation hymns and prayers. This will be followed by a bring and share Coronation Celebration Lunch in and around the Barn. Please look out for details of other events happening in your community.

News from the Barn. First, may I thank our cheerful and hardworking team who made Warm Welcome Mondays such happy occasions for all who came. We were also most grateful to Rockland St. Mary Parish Council and South Norfolk District Councils for generous grants that underwrote our costs. We're planning to re-open on a weekly basis next autumn and winter and are considering whether to hold Warm Welcomes occasionally between now and then to help the community that gathered there keep in touch.

† Thurton Benefice Update

Easter in the Thurton Benefice

As we approach the Easter season, things are getting very busy in the churches around the benefice. We are coming to the end of Lent, the time of reflection, where we seek forgiveness for all the things we have done wrong and look for ways to reorder our lives, to make us the best version of ourselves and now we approach The Cross.

You are welcome to join us for any or all of our services and if you have never been before, we will be very happy to see you and we will guide you through the service.

On **April 2nd** we will celebrate Palm Sunday. We will make this with a service in **Yelverton Church at 10am**. But we will begin with a short procession from the school up to the church as we remind ourselves of Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem when people scattered palm leaves in front of him. We will bless and share palm leaves woven into crosses to remind us of the events.

We will then hold a short service of Compline or night prayer in 3 of our churches, each evening from Monday to Wednesday. These are very peaceful, reflective services - a very calming way to end the day.

Monday 3rd April - Yelverton 7 pm

Tuesday 4th April - Bergh Apton 7 pm

Wednesday 5th April - Ashby St Mary 7 pm

On Maundy Thursday, 6th April we will hold a service at Framingham Pigot Church as we remember The Last Supper, the final meal Jesus shared with his friends before his arrest and death. The word 'Maundy' refers to the rite of foot washing as before the meal Jesus took on the role of a servant and washed his friends' feet . We strip the church of decoration and keep a vigil in the candle light.

On Good Friday 7th April we will hold our pilgrimage walk which begins at 9.30 am at Framingham Pigot with a short service of Holy Communion. We will then walk to each of our churches in turn finishing at Ashby St Mary. You are welcome to join us for all or part of our walk. Feel free to bring your dog too!

Yelverton - 11 am
Bergh Apton - 12.30 pm
Thurton - 1.30 pm
Ashby - 2.30 pm

On Saturday the churches are often a hive of activity as we prepare for Easter.

We begin our celebrations on Easter Eve when the service starts with the lighting of the new fire. We start in darkness outside the church and the fire is lit, symbolising Jesus's eternal light.



From that fire we light our special paschal candle and the light is carried into church and shared with the congregation. The service is at 8pm at Thurton Church.

On Easter Sunday we have services at 9.30 am in Bergh Apton and Yelverton, and 11am at Framingham Pigot as we celebrate Christ's victory over death.

Celebrating two medieval Norfolk Women's faith in 2023 In 1413, a woman entered a church in Great Yarmouth, prayed in front of a statue of the Virgin Mary, then set off towards the quay. Her name was Margery Kempe. She was leaving England for a long and dangerous pilgrimage to Jerusalem that would take nearly three years. Margery was the wife of a prosperous King's Lynn merchant and mother of fourteen children. Following the birth of her first child, she had experienced intense mental distress and hallucinations. After recovering, she felt called to lead a holy life in the footsteps of Christ and his saints. She shared her faith with everyone who would listen and challenged powerful people over their way of life. This was a dangerous occupation for a medieval woman, and she was threatened with burning at the stake more than once. She frequently spent long periods weeping loudly.


Perhaps it's not surprising that on one of her pilgrimages her companions jumped ship, leaving her to sail away alone. She may have been a difficult person to live with, but it's hard to read her 'Book of Margery Kempe' without cheering her on.

She possessed the rare courage of someone who stands alone against an angry crowd, trusting only in God for safety.

Her book is remarkable for two reasons. It was the first autobiography in English, and secondly, it shines light on an ordinary medieval woman's life, her hopes, fears and struggles. Nothing like it has been found anywhere else, so we can be proud of this slightly wild, determined, caring, devout daughter of Norfolk. This year sees her 650th birthday, celebrated by public events in King's Lynn, her hometown, where she prayed in front of statues in the Minster. Soon, a statue in her honour will be unveiled there.

There's another 650th anniversary connected with Margery too. Before she reached Great Yarmouth, Margery visited a holy woman living in a cell at St. Julian's Church in Norwich.

The holy woman confirmed that Margery was living in accordance with God's will,



encouraging her to persevere through all difficulties, trusting God to help her. That holy woman is now known as Julian of Norwich.

650 years ago, Julian saw a vision of Christ during a near-death experience that filled her with light and hope. We can read her 'Revelations of the Divine Love' as well. You may already know her most famous message: 'All shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well'. The Friends of Julian of Norwich are marking this anniversary with a programme of events and writing and art competitions. More details can be found on their website: https://julianofnorwich.org/

Julian's writing has also helped to shape the Barn's life over several years, and the spiritual direction that Helen and I offer there, also reflects her legacy. On **Sunday May 21st Still with Julian** will bring together some of her words, with music, silence and images to reflect on her spiritual wisdom and experiences.

Still with Julian begins at 4 pm and all are welcome. Take a look at page 3 in this newspaper to find details of how to enter the writing competition to mark the 650th anniversary of Julian's book, 'Revelations of the Divine Love'.

Green Fingers

A good many of us spend time in our sheds and gardens, using compost to provide food for the plants and bulbs. Apparently the lifespan of new compost in a pot is only a few weeks so during the summer season we are supposed to add some fertiliser such as liquid seaweed. Without these nutrients, our plants would not grow so well.

So what do we do with old or used compost? Does it have any life left in it? I keep mine in a big bin for the autumn, then put things like dahlia tubers in it to keep them warm and dry for the winter before potting them up again in the spring in new compost. I also use some to mulch and protect plants in flower beds over the winter.

What about us? Are we still sitting in old compost that has lost its ability to feed us? Do we need some liquid seaweed to keep us going? Do we need a little something to pep us up?

I recently sat next to an older couple at the football who brought a flask of hot chocolate. I was intrigued to see a miniature bottle of Glenfiddich whiskey come out of the bag to pep up their half time refreshment.

A different sort of spirit comes to mind, the Holy Spirit, who has the ability to pep us up and keep us going. Not just for half time, but for all time. We all have different seasons in our lives. Sometimes we need some old compost to comfort us and keep us warm. Sometimes we need some liquid seaweed to wake us up or keep us going. So whether times for you are good right now or perhaps sad and difficult, just remember we have a Friend, the Holy Spirit, who will help us and gives us just what we need.

Researching the history of Surlingham Ferry




Surlingham
