Serving not being served

AS they went along they were arguing about who was the best. "Well I was here first," said one. "That doesn't matter, I've worked harder!" said another. Someone else reckoned they were the favourite anyway. This sounds like playground arguing doesn't it? We'd never fall into arguing about who was the best. Or would we? We all have a bit of an 'I'm best' streak, even if most of the time we manage to keep it quiet!

The above argument is actually a picture of what was happened among Jesus' disciples on their way Jerusalem. It's a bit of a surprise because while some were focussing on who was most important, Jesus had been saying this:

'We are going up to

Jerusalem,' he said, 'and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles, who will mock him and spit on him, flog him and kill him. Three days later he will rise.' (Mark 10:33-34).

He was talking about what was about to happen to him. He often described himself as the 'Son of Man'. He was about to be arrested and crucified. He would die and on the third day rise again.

So it's a bit odd that his friends were busy talking about their power and position. In response to them he said that their behaviour didn't fit with his ways. It was more like the ways the Romans



behaved. He said that, "those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exerauthority cise them." You can read everything he said to them in Mark 10:35-45. What is important to know is that he went on to say, "Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for

many." (Mark 10:43-45).

He was showing them that his death and rising again were an act of service. His life was being given in exchange for the lives of many. Like a ransom rescuing someone from kidnap, Jesus paid to release us from sin, judgment and death. As he hung on the cross he died the death we should die and rose to give us new life instead forgiven people. Through him we are free to live eternal life. What a wonderful act of service!




