Welcome to our monthly newsletter, which we hope will keep you informed of what's happening in our parish life, the community and also more widely.

From death to Resurrection—Alleluia Christ is Risen!



As you all receive this newsletter we are in the middle of Holy Week. The journey through Holy week takes us through the events of the last week of Jesus' life on earth. From the jubilation of Jesus' entry in Jerusalem, which we celebrated on Palm Sunday, to the tables in the Temple being overturned in his anger at those cheating and overcharging for the temple services and sac-



rifices, we move to Maundy Thursday remembering the Last Supper which Jesus shared with his close friends and the reenactment of which, we continue Sunday by Sunday through our Communion services. That first Maundy Thursday ended in chaos and betrayal as Jesus was arrested after his anguished night spent in prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane. We move then into Good Friday remembering the false trial and accusations leveled at Jesus and ultimately the agony and suffering he endured on the cross, demonstrating the full extent of his love for all humanity as he willingly gave his life to redeem each and every single person in his time and in all time to follow. The emptiness of Holy Saturday follows as his disciples mourn the death of their dear friend and teacher and they flounder lost and hopeless. Then a new day dawns and the extraordinary news of his resurrection begins to spread, and despair turns to joy, delight and celebration as they encounter the risen Christ.

We are an 'Easter People' we already know the truth of Jesus' death and resurrection, however Holy week serves as an opportunity each year, to remind us of just how great a story the Christian story is, and the impact it has had on the world and will continue to have for many, many generations to come. The meaning of Easter is still as relevant for you and I today as it was over 2000 years ago and its good to be reminded of that!

Holy week takes us through the full gamut of human experiences and emotions and is a microcosm of our lives. We too experience at one time or another, joy, delight, jubilation, despair, mourning, suffering, hope, new life and rebirth. Sometimes these emotions and experiences are linked and run parallel, other timers they follow in sequence or are cyclical.

Whatever our experience or emotions at this present time, we can be assured that Jesus our saviour, our redeemer, has experienced them for himself and knows exactly how we feel. And more so, has promised to always be with us to strengthen and encourage, to lift up and challenge, to bring peace and reconciliation and to join in with both our pain and suffering or our joy and delight.

As we look in despair at our world, the violence and chaos, the corruption and greed, the suffering of the innocents, our times are no different to the times in which Jesus was born. Yet through the ages people have come to faith, they have trusted, waited patiently and found new hope and joy. And even in our current period of history we can do the same, there is always hope in Jesus Christ. There is always light in the darkness, Christ is the light of the world!

Wishing you all a renewed experience of Easter, a deepening understanding of our Christian faith, and the transformation in our lives which only comes through faith and trust in our risen Lord Jesus Christ.

Alleluia he is risen indeed!







Foreign currency:

You may remember in 2022 we asked anyone who had unwanted foreign banknotes or coins to donate them to the church, and after conversion to sterling the value would be added to our fundraising efforts.

We had an excellent response receiving over 120 different notes from 44 different countries (with all five continents represented), and almost 1500 coins from 70 countries. We found a company that converts all of this into sterling and who add 5% to the payment when it is to a charity. As a result, we have received an incredible £455.58!

The company provide a breakdown of the amount paid for each class of note and coin, making for interesting reading. Who would have known that 130 Burundi Francs in demonetised banknotes were worth a penny, or that 8080 Slovak Korun in withdrawn notes were worth £128.71! Banknotes are divided into current, withdrawn and demonetised notes with a different rate for each. Coins are divided into current and withdrawn. Only two notes were worthless – 2 withdrawn Bulgarian Leu. Coins that are demonetised, out of circulation or otherwise unexchangeable have a scrap value of £1.30 per kilowe had 5 kilos worth.

The coins covered almost two centuries of use and included those of Napoleon III, Emperor of France, Vitor Emmanuel II King of Italy, and George IV King of Great Britain. Many thanks for taking part in the exercise, and if you find any more coins under mattresses or down the side of chairs, we now have an easy way of putting them to use. Colin Thompson

For many years Anne Burtenshaw and others, walking to and from the Parish Centre kitchen with jugs of water, thought "If only..." and dropped hints to the Fabric team about how useful a water supply in the church would be.

And now it's finally happened! Some inspired work by Brian Thatcher, Clive Eatwell and lain Buchanan has provided the necessary pipe work and the tap is fully operational, not just for use every Sunday but for Bumps, Babies & Toddlers on Monday mornings and any other group using the church during the week.



Ethical banking

Barclays bank has often been the target of climate action for its investment in the fossil fuel industry, but it isn't the only guilty bank. Oxfam is the latest charity to cease banking with Barclays, after protests were held by a group of Christian climate campaigners. Other organisations, including Christian Aid, Greenbelt and Sheffield Cathedral have also severed ties with Barclays, which has been the largest investor in fossil fuels in Europe since 2016.



<u>MotherTree</u> is an organisation that can help you switch, whether as an individual or representing a church. You can listen to a presentation from their CEO (see the money session of the sustainability talk recordings listed below), and their website can take you through the process.
