## FROM THE VICAR

#### **Dear Friends**

Eastertide is a time for great celebration – focussing our attention on the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, and the great promises of a share in that new life that he promises to all his faithful people. As we entered into this season, our brothers and sisters in the Roman Catholic Church faced the news of the death of Pope Francis on Easter Monday. He was a Pope who stood firm in his belief that the good news of the Easter faith was good news for the whole of humanity, and especially for those who are poor or marginalised. His determination to bear witness to that faith, offering Easter blessings just a day before his death, ought to be an inspiration to all Christian people, encouraging us to make sure we make the risen Jesus known to those on the edge of our society here in Accrington.

For us, in the parish of the Good Shepherd, the journey through Eastertide brings with it the joy of our celebration of our Feast of Title; Good Shepherd Sunday, on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, 11 May. Our celebration of this Feast will begin on the day itself, with a joint Family Celebration Mass at St Mary Magdalen's at 11.00 am, followed by a free meal together. St Mary Magdalen's School Choir will join us for this celebration, and I hope that we can support them, and join in these celebrations.

The following week, 18 May, we welcome Bishop Philip to celebrate a Joint Parish Mass at St Andrew's at 10.30 am (note the unusual time!). This will be an opportunity for a more formal celebration with our bishop, and will be followed by soup and rolls and a glass of something to mark the occasion. Please note that on both of these Sundays, there will be no other masses celebrated in the parish. To add to the festivities, Friday Praise on Friday 16 May will also focus on Jesus the Good Shepherd.

It is my hope that coming together for these celebrations will allow us to grow closer together as a united parish, so that we can better serve our local community, and make the joy of the Resurrection of Jesus known to the people among whom we live and work. Please do support these services, and encourage family and friends to join us, so that we can them a fitting occasion in the life of our parish.

#### FROM THE CHURCH FATHERS

From a Homily of St John Chrysostom on the Acts of the Apostles (set for the Office of Readings for the Feast of St Matthias (14 May))

In those days, Peter, stood up in the midst of the disciples and said.... As the fiery spirit to whom the flock was entrusted by Christ and as the leader in the band of the apostles, Peter always took the initiative in speaking: My brothers, we must choose from among our number. He left the decision to the whole body, at once augmenting the honour of those elected and avoiding any suspicion of partiality. For such great occasions can easily lead to trouble.

Did not Peter then have the right to make the choice himself? Certainly he had the right, but he did not want to give the appearance of showing special favour to anyone. Besides he was not yet endowed with the Spirit. And they nominated two, we read, Joseph, who was called Barsabbas and surnamed Justus, and Matthias. He himself did not nominate them; all present did. But it was he who brought the issue forward, pointing out that it was not his own idea but had been suggested to him by a scriptural prophecy. So he was speaking not as a teacher but as an interpreter.

So, he goes on, we must choose from those men who lived in our company. Notice how insistent he is that they should be eyewitnesses. Even though the Spirit would come to ratify the choice, Peter regards this prior qualification as most important.

Those who lived in our company, he continued, all through the time when the Lord Jesus came and went among us. He refers to those who had dwelt with Jesus, not just those who



had been his disciples. For of course from the very beginning many had followed him. Notice how it is written that Peter himself was one of the two who had listened to John, and followed Jesus.

All through the time when the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning with the baptism of John – rightly so, because no one knew what had happened before that time, although they were to know of it later through the Spirit.

Up to the day, Peter added, on which he was taken up from us — one of these must be made a witness along with us of his resurrection. He did not say "a witness of the rest of his actions" but only a witness of the resurrection. That witness would be more believable who could declare that he who ate and drank and was crucified also rose from the dead. He needed to be a witness not of the times before or after that event, and not of the signs and wonders, but only of the resurrection itself. For the rest happened by general admission, openly; but the resurrection took place secretly, and was known to these men only.

And they all prayed together, saying: You, Lord, know the hearts of men; make your choice known to us. "You," not "we." Appropriately they said that he knew the hearts of men, because the choice was to be made by him, not by others.

They spoke with such confidence, because someone had to be appointed. They did not say "choose" but make known to us the chosen one; the one you choose, they said, fully aware that everything was pre-ordained by God. They then drew lots. For they did not think themselves worthy to make the choice of their own accord, and therefore they wanted some sign for their instruction.

# **Our three Priorities for 2025**

As part of our Vision, we have identified the following three priorities for the coming year:

#### 1 Develop a Social Committee to work on our welcome and hospitality

We recognise the need to strengthen our relationships through spending time together as a joint parish, and hope that this strategy will enable new people to come in and share our joy in the Gospel. As part of this, we will also seek to review our ways of welcoming and sharing hospitality in our regular services, such that they may be the best that they can be, and in particular that our after-service refreshments will be ones that new people are drawn to join us in.

#### 2 Explore ways of reaching out to the forgotten parts of our parish

We will work out a strategy to reach out to the former parishes of Accrington St Peter and Church Kirk St James, to ensure that the love of God is shared across the whole of our United Parish. In order to do this, we will identify a sub-committee of the PCC who can begin to make some exploration of what might be possible in those areas. We recognise that we have the resource of St Peter's and St Nicholas's Schools, and that there are already some contacts through the regular services at Spring Hill Care Home.

# 3 Establish a Stewardship Campaign, to enable us to be joyful, generous stewards of all that God gives us

As a parish we are conscious of the need to finance our work sufficiently. We are committed to working with the Diocese to ensure that we have conversations regarding our Parish Share, and we strive to ensure the negotiated amount requested is paid each year. We are also aware of some significant work that is required on our church buildings, as well as the need for sufficient funding for mission and outreach in our Parish. To that end, we are also committed to exploring any possible funding streams to help us to realise our vision to be 'welcoming churches sharing the joy of life with Jesus'.



#### **Notes**

- 1. Every lay person whose name is entered on the Church Electoral Roll of the parish (and no other person) is entitled to vote at the election of parochial representatives of the laity.
- 2. A person is qualified to be elected a parochial representative of the laity if -
  - (a) his or her name is entered on the Church Electoral Roll of the parish and, unless he or is under 18, has been entered there for at least the preceding six months;
  - (b) he or she is an actual communicant (which means that he has received Communion according to the use of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with the Church of England at least three times during the twelve months preceding the date of the election);
  - (c) he or she is at least 16; and
  - (d) he or she is not disqualified as referred to in paragraph 3 of these Notes.
- 3. (1) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden or a member of a parochial church council, a district church council or a joint council if the person is disqualified from being a trustee of a charity (and the disqualification is not subject to a waiver which permits membership of a parochial church council, district church council or joint council).
  - (2) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person is included in a barred list (within the meaning of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006).
  - (3) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person has been convicted of an offence mentioned in Schedule 1 to the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (with that expression being construed in accordance with Rule 71(2) of the Church Representation Rules).
  - (4) A person's disqualification under sub-paragraph (3) may be waived by the bishop of the diocese by giving the person notice in writing.
  - (5) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council if the person has been disqualified from holding office under section 10(6) of the Incumbent (Vacation of Benefices) Measure 1977.
- 4. <sup>4</sup> A scheme is in operation in this parish which provides that any person entitled to vote in the elections of parochial representatives of the laity to the parochial church council or to the deanery synod or to both may apply on the appropriate form to the Minister of the parish (or other person signing below) for a postal vote. The completed form must be received before the commencement of the annual parochial church meeting.

<sup>4</sup> This paragraph should be deleted if no scheme for postal voting is in operation in the parish.
