Thankyou Chris and Martyn

On Thursday 5th June many of us gathered to welcome home Chris and Martyn at the end of their 75+ mile long Pilgrimage and Sponsored Walk from Hereford Cathedral to St Mary Magdalen's Church Hilperton. During the four day trek they experienced changeable weather from beautiful sunshine and blue skies

on the Monday to torrential heavy rain on the Thursday. The route had taken them by road from Hereford into Wales and to Monmouth where they spent the first night. On Tuesday they walked through the beautiful Wye Valley, past Tintern Abbey and into Chepstow for the next stopover. Day three began with a walk across the Severn Bridge and back into England towards Bryste (the Welsh for Bristol). On arriving in the City the two native Bristolians made their way to the Cathedral for Evensong before going their separate ways (still on foot) to spend the night at their respective family homes in different parts of the city. On Thursday morning they met up for the last, longest and wettest day of the walk leading them out of Bristol along the Avon Valley and into Bath. After a brief visit to the Abbey they walked up the very long and very steep Widcombe Hill to Claverton and then descended down to the canal towpath. By late afternoon they were back in the Benefice and after a quick freshen up it was time for the "Welcome Home" at St Mary's. Chris and Martyn said they

were overwhelmed by the number of people who had turned out for their return including many members of the Cub Pack who were chanting "Reverend Chris". After some cold drinks and nibbles everyone made their way into the Chancel for a short Compline



Service, led by Joy, giving thanks for the safe return of the walkers at the end of a quite remarkable achievement. Congratulations and thankyou to Chris and Martyn and to everyone who donated/sponsored them. The total raised currently stands at £2,742 – another remarkable achievement!

From the Rectory

A lot of my time at the moment is on planning the Theology Taster Day we are running in the Benefice on Saturday 5th July. It's happening at St Mary Magdalen Church and the idea is to do a day to explain what theology is all about and try and take the sting out of it. I love theology, so I have to be careful to remember that, just because I find things really interesting, doesn't mean everyone else does!

That said, when I mention theology in churches, I frequently get two responses:

- 1)Oh, I'm not clever enough for all that.
- 2) What has theology got to do with what we do in church? Our hope on the 5th of July is to show that you don't have to be "clever enough" to do theology and that it has a lot to do with what we do in church. In fact, I'd go so far as to say that what we do in church is almost entirely theology, as at its most basic the word simply means "God words" so it's what we're doing any time we talk about God.

Some examples might be helpful. Central to what we do in church is trying to understand who Jesus is, what he was talking about and why he did the things he did. Those are all big theological questions. Similarly, when we talk about the Holy Spirit, what are we talking about? Most people have a working idea of who Jesus is, at least some knowledge of the stories, but the Holy Spirit is a lot harder to define or conceptualise.

I can't say we'll answer the questions, but we'll be taking a day to try and think a few things through. There will be a session on all the different things that make up theology, like what is the church, what does it mean to be saved and what does the bible say is going to happen in the future. We'll look in depth at the story of the bible and at the history of the church, there will be an introduction to Christian Spirituality and we will finish the day by considering different perspectives on faith with black, feminist, womanist and queer theologies.

As I said, I love theology, and I'm really excited to share some of that with others. My prayer is that this will be a day of enthusiasm and engagement, that people will enjoy what we're doing. And, maybe, that we even learn something new and find something that helps us to grow in faith.


Hilperton Cemetery. Afterwards everyone is invited to join the family for refreshments at the Rugby Club.

If you are a little flush; you can do online shopping with ASDA as they will deliver to us on your behalf. Please drop into the building as we now do a breakfast for the homeless so eggs are always needed plus cheese, butter bacon etc as we have a fridge freezer, and fridge. Fruit and vegetables are always welcome but do not put in a trolley. Please continue to donate to us so we can keep blessing the people of Trowbridge. Thank you all.

Please use the collection boxes in the porches of St Mary Magdalen's and St Michael's to drop off food donations etc. Bill Stubbs then very kindly collects everything up and drops it off at Storehouse. As always Bill thankyou so much for all you do on this.

Melksham Foodbank continue to need all items but in particular at the moment require tinned meat and fish, pasta and squash, the demand for support is very high

(please ensure all items are well within the best before date). They can also take large bags of rice, tea bags, sugar & pasta as these can be decanted into smaller bags for distribution. Please take your donations to the porch at St George's, Semington before 6pm on Wednesday.

In 2024 Melksham FoodBank gave out 1538 bags of food for single people, 3693 to families and 3086 to children, although this is slightly fewer than 2023. In December 2024 they were supporting 276 adults and 212 children. These figures include 24 pensioners, 13 disabled adults and 4 disabled children. They helped 198 households, but that does not include one-off bags taken by agency workers.

All this shows that our continued support of Melksham FoodBank and Trowbridge StoreHouse is vital, and a part of our response to God's generosity to us.


