Living Water in the Dry Weather

We are well and truly now into the summer months of 2025. I am much more an autumn person, but I have really been enjoying the weather when walking back and forth around the parish whether I've been up at The Curzon school or running the toddler group or the youth group at St Nick's. This got me thinking. In the UK the weather is always a hot topic, and summer doesn't always guarantee lovely blue skies and the sun shining. I recently read an article that said records show that our Springtime has gone down as the driest in years—sunny skies and barely a drop of rain. Now this can have a mixture of responses, sun great or instead of praising the sun, the environmental agency stated that whilst the reservoirs are currently fairly health, there is a 'medium' risk of drought this summer. While it's been a joy to bask in the warmth and watch the birds sing and the beauty of nature around us, the dryness is a reminder of how much we depend on water for life, growth, and refreshment.



Knowing and worshipping God and sharing His love

In John 7:38, Jesus says, "Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." What an image that is—especially in the recent dry season weather wise that we've been having. This drew a parallel for me, that when the ground is parched and the days are hot, our souls can sometimes feel the same. But Jesus offers something deeper than physical refreshment: a source of life and renewal that never runs dry (unlike the UK's reservoirs, hopefully not). What a promise!

We need water for our bodies physically and we need the living water for our souls spiritually. Have you ever had a drink on a hot day and then thought, 'I'm still thirsty!'? As not all drinks are good for rehydration, not all sources can quench our spiritual thirst either. I often listen to podcasts as I walk to work and in one, they talked about the difference between a fountain and a cistern and the different sources of water. In Jeremiah 2:13, God laments that His people have forsaken Him, "the spring of living water," and instead dug "broken cisterns that cannot hold water." It's a powerful image—turning to sources that are not fresh, with that promise of satisfaction but leave us dry. This summer, as we seek to be filled and to pour out to others, may we be reminded to draw only from the true Source: Jesus who loves us and wants to give freely the fresh and wonderful living water. His water sustains, restores, and flows

endlessly.

Last month, we celebrated Pentecost—that powerful moment when the Holy Spirit was poured out on the disciples like a rushing wind and tongues of fire. It was the beginning of the Church's mission to bring the message of Jesus to the world. That same Spirit is still being poured out today, refreshing hearts, renewing lives, and equipping us to be bearers of God's love wherever we go. Pentecost reminds us that the living water Jesus promised is not a trickle, but an outpouring meant to overflow into every part of our lives—and beyond us, into our community.

So how do we experience that living water today? It might be through prayer, through Scripture, or simply pausing in stillness to reconnect with the Spirit. It might be through gathering in worship, through acts of kindness, or by noticing God's hand in the everyday in nature. But remember, Jesus didn't just promise water to refresh us—He said it would flow from within us. That's our calling this summer: to be channels of living water for others and out into our community. Whether it's a smile for a neighbour, a hand offered in help, or volunteering at a church event like our Family Fun Day on the 30th July, we have the chance to be a source of life and hope in our community—even in the hotter weather because we have our source of living water from Jesus in our lives and hearts sustaining us.

Let's not hold back. The church is buzzing with plans and purpose this summer—not standing idly by but stepping forward in faith and service. As we embrace the sunshine let's also embrace the amazing nourishment Jesus gives as our living water and our role as living witnesses of Christ's love and be filled and pour out from our surplus because we are receiving from the fresh and living water. Let the living water flow from within you this season—and watch how it brings life all around.


