Church News

On 5th August in the year 604 – just 1,421 years ago – a baby boy was born in Bamburgh Castle on the Northumbrian Coast – a son for the then King of Northumbria. The castle has been rebuilt more than once since then, but the boy who was born that day is still remembered by people all over Europe.

Here are some thoughts from our Churchwarden, Clare Chittenden.

"Did you know that St.Oswald is one of the most important European Saints? He is the patron Saint of Dean Church and that his saint's day is August 5th. Many churches are dedicated to St Oswald.

Oswald was born at Bamburgh Castle where he lived with his parents and siblings, his father was the pagan king of Northumbria. After his father's death in battle Oswald and two of his siblings went to Iona where they were brought up and taught by the community.

Oswald was a soldier who returned to Northumbria after his brother also died in battle trying to regain the throne of Northumbria. Oswald was victorious and became king. He was a wise and just king who brought Education and Christianity to the area; helped by Aidan who came from the community at Iona at Oswald's request to set up the community at Lindisfarne.

St. Oswald and St. Aidan are depicted in the stained-glass window at the front of Dean Church; they knew each other well and worked as a very effective team. They have both given us a Christian inheritance."

On Sunday 10th August at 10 o'clock our Church Service will be a celebration and thanksgiving for St Oswald, with the opportunity to learn more about this very special man, and how he fits in to Dean Church for more than 850 years. Oswald and Aidan worked together for less than 8 years, but they travelled widely across England, and it is known that they did visit and preach at Grasmere where the church is named after Oswald. Whether they called in at Dean we don't know, but their message got here, and when our lovely old church was built in 1175 it was named after him too. He was the trailblazer for the Christian message in this part of the world, and there have been some significant people who have followed that trail blazed to Dean in the past 850 years – take a look at how and when that original building in 1175 has been transformed into this place today – that transformation influenced by Oswald's vision. Education came to Dean in 1597 with the establishment of the boys grammar school in the church grounds. In the churchyard surrounding the Church – earliest readable gravestone dated back to 1683 – are inscriptions which show that Oswald's message got through to countless people down the centuries. Moving on to the 19th century – the Victorian and Edwardian eras – saw the arrival of Samuel Sherwen – the first schoolteacher at the brand new Paddle School in 1814, also took on the post of curate in Dean Church in 1815 - his family – traders in Whitehaven – "bought the living" in 1825 – 200 years ago – and he became the Rector of Dean – the first of a chain of

three generations of Sherwens for the following 118 years, in which time they influenced the development of Dean parish – Samuel had built, at his own expense, Dean School (for girls) in the late 1860, which became the national school for both girls & boys, when education for children became compulsory.in 1890. His nephew William had built in 1912, at his own expense, the Kirkstile Hall – both significant additions to Dean & the surrounding district – if Samuel had not heard and responded to Oswald's call, Dean would be a different place today. So it is right and proper that we should celebrate the birth of Oswald, and if you feel like joining us for that celebration you will be warmly welcomed on Sunday 10th August at 10 a.m.

Christian Aid week 2025 Outcome

The amount collected during Christian Aid week in the Parish this year was £837, including Gift Aid and on-line donations, which was a creditable result from our small communities and which was of the same order as last year's total. It would not have been achieved without everybody's contributions, large or small, which do go a long way in Christian Aid's hands by its use of local agencies to provide aid in each country.

A big thank you for the generosity of everyone who contributed to making a difference to those less fortunate than ourselves, and also to those who delivered the envelopes, or acted as a collection point for them, without whom it would also not have been possible.

Over the last couple of months some of our members have been very busy. Our enthusiastic darts team were runners up in the county darts league competition. Household tips.

Crisp a wilted lettuce by opening it out and leaving it to soak in iced water for a few minutes.


