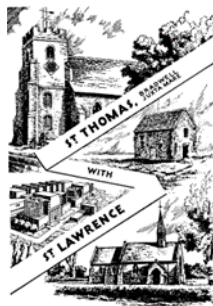

News from RAF Bradwell Bay

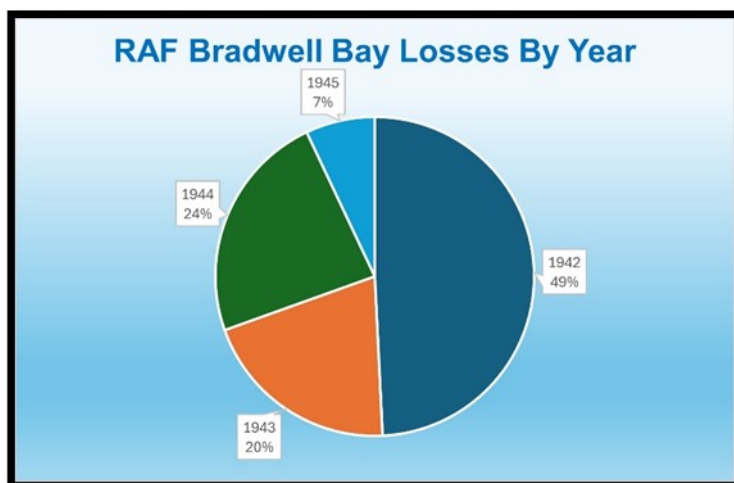
80 years ago, the whole nation was jubilant as the war in Europe had stopped. However, the war had not finished as the war in Japan continued until 15th August when Japan surrendered.

Carrying on with my research, I was recently asked by the Essex Society for Family History for a list of names on the RAF Memorial at Bradwell.



This made me realise that while I had information on the people named on the memorial it was scattered throughout my archives.

I am working to collate this into a book. So far this has enabled me to find that 49% of all losses were incurred in the first year of operation, mostly from 418 Squadron with some from 23 Squadron.



The first loss was within 2 weeks of the aerodrome becoming operational. On 28th April 1942 F/O Askwith, Sgt. Hardy and F/L Mapes took off on an intruder raid to Holland. They were shot down. Askwith and Hardy were killed and Mapes was severely injured and taken prisoner. He spent the rest of the war as a POW.

The memorial is an attraction in the village. Walkers often come across it by accident and many people make a special journey to visit. Relatives come to see their relatives' names. A couple of weeks ago I was at the memorial and met a retired Air Commodore and a retired RAF Warrant Officer. I also met a radio presenter who was really interested in the memorial and the work of the RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group. We really need a museum near to the memorial! (Multi-millionaires please note)!

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group has a new Facebook page [rafbradwell bay preservation group](https://www.facebook.com/rafbradwellbay) and our new website www.rafbradwellbay.com.

We are recruiting trustees to work alongside our management committee. If you have skills such as business-related skills, we could use them or if you would like to get involved in this local project.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial.

The Othona Community

How do you know that summer has begun? Is it a holiday? A hot day or two? Planting out the runner beans?

At Othona from we know the summer has started when the school groups arrive. Here they are, from Essex and East London, excited coach loads, classes of around 30 boys and girls aged about nine or ten, with their teachers, each here for a night or two during June and July.

Some youngsters have never had a night away from home before; some have rarely visited the countryside or the sea; and probably none will ever have experienced life in Community. Here they may take the first tiny steps: helping with chores such as clearing the tables, experiencing our wonderful St. Peter's Chapel and the surrounding Roman history, learning together in mixed groups, discovering and sharing the joy of the wildlife from mini-beasts to shore crabs, and playing together in our wide open spaces, with electronic games and phones all out of sight.

Here there is never a dull moment for the resident team and local volunteers. No soon as the mid-week school groups have gone than the next weekend event begins - maybe a Church Group, a quiet retreat on our Programme, or a private family booking. This requires not just the re-organising of beds and bedrooms, the cleaning and tidying, and the review and re-ordering of what we are short of – mainly food, it's amazing what a good appetite people get with all that fresh air! The Othona team are part of a caring community, with all the mental, emotional and spiritual demands that are essential to the apparently smooth running of that unique pattern of Work, Worship, Study and Play together which unites Othona both here at Bradwell, and in West Dorset. Eighty years have passed since our founder, Norman Motley, started to seek "a place to which people would come for short periods of one to seven weeks for what we hoped would be a time of discovery and renewal, with a view to returning better equipped to cope with the business of living. This obviously presupposed a permanent nucleus or group which would be the serving core of the Community." (From "Much Ado About Something.") Before his death in 1980 Norman shared his hope that Othona would be here all year round to open the arms of Community to all who sought that Christian fellowship, inclusive of people of all faiths and none. Here we are.

Now we move into summer 2025 with the Pilgrimage and the season of evening worship in the Chapel shared with the local people of St Thomas with St Lawrence. And for Othona it is the time of the Summer Season, with our full



programme of fun and thought-provoking activities. Do have a look at the programme on line or pick up a [paper copy from Othona or your Church. Othona welcomes local people as volunteers or to book by day the activities, share a meal or drop in for a cuppa.

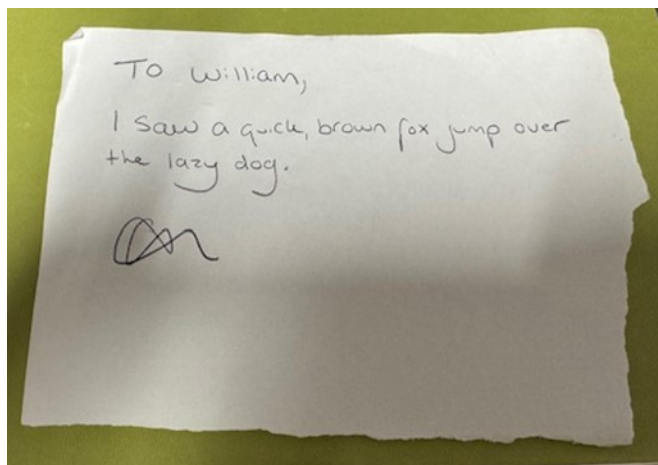

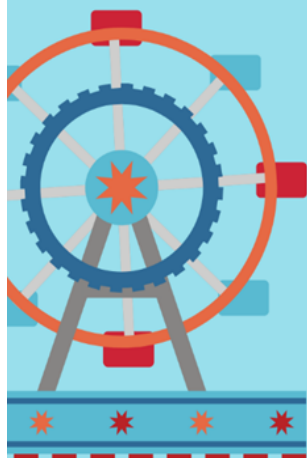
