### Are You Thirsty?

As July ushers in its sun-drenched days, village life in the Crediton and Creedy Mission Communities continues its graceful rhythm. Summer offers quintessential village events – flower shows, fetes, revels, and weddings – perfect for gathering with loved ones, friends, and neighbours. Ruth and I eagerly anticipate these joyful festivities, which remind us that life is best experienced in and through our communities.

While Spring invited reflection on God's promise of new life, July beckons us to consider the deep sustenance that supports our lives and communities. Historically, wells have been at the heart of rural settings, vital arteries providing life-giving water. These ancient wells were not only sources of refreshment but also places of gathering and profound encounter.

The Bible echoes this significance. Think of Jacob's Well, where Jesus met the Samaritan woman, offering "living water" that would quench her thirst forever (John 4:10-14). Or Isaiah's joyful proclamation: "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation" (Isaiah 12:3).

In July's warmth, staying hydrated is crucial, both physically and spiritually. As it has been said, 'you and I are spiritual beings having a human experience' (Pierre Teilhard de Chardin), and not the other way round. So, seeing the 'well' as a place of spiritual encounter with Jesus, is just as fundamental to our wellbeing as drinking fresh water. Are you meeting with him? Do you want to meet with Jesus more? Are you thirsty?

Side note: On my dog walks, I've noticed what appears to be a well along the Millennium cycle path between Sandford and Crediton. I believe it might be connected to the ancient pool in Creedy Park, once called Carswell, or "Kirswell" on an old map. Perhaps someone can confirm this?

There's also 'The Well' in Crediton – not the one in the public park, but a monthly gathering for worship and encounter at Holy Cross. Details can be found in this Hub Post. I've been attending since it began last autumn, and the congregation is growing. The contemporary worship, the prayers, and shared testimonies are deeply grounded in the life of our local churches and villages, and in the lives of those who attend. Each month I can see many are being encouraged and refreshed as they meet at 'The Well'.

God is doing something special at "The Well." Take a look for more details in this edition of the Hub Post.



### **Bishops' Statement on Gaza**

This week Bishop Mike has been at the House of Bishops meeting in York. Earlier today the bishops issued a statement on the current situation in Gaza, calling on the Israeli Government to end its "collective punishment" of the people of Gaza, for all sides to end the war to prevent further suffering and for churches to continue financially supporting aid organisations and to pray for the ministry on the ground of the Diocese of Jerusalem. This is an extract from their statement:

We have watched with horror and outrage as siege and starvation are used as a weapon of war in Gaza, and as hospitals and health facilities have been systemically targeted. Over the last three months, the Israeli government's deliberate denial of food and medical aid to an entire civilian population is an atrocity that defies our common humanity. It is the very definition of collective punishment and has no moral justification.

We note that the Israeli Government has been challenged before the International Court of Justice. Starving children cannot wait for legal rulings given that every country has an obligation to prevent crimes against humanity. As Bishops we are compelled to state clearly and unequivocally that the death, suffering and destruction being inflicted on Gaza is a grave sin that violently assaults God-given human dignity and the very integrity of God's creation.

We call on all sides to end the war. We call on relevant UN bodies to be allowed to administer all necessary aid in line with long standing humanitarian principles. We call for the immediate release of all hostages without condition. The continued expansion of settlements in the West Bank, the appalling levels of settler violence, and the forced displacements and house demolitions must cease.

We support and applaud all those Jewish voices, both inside and outside of Israel, that are courageously pressing the Israeli Government to end the war. We add our voices to those urging the Government of Israel to turn away from its current trajectory and to affirm life and human dignity for all

### Update from The Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre 16th June 2025

At this time of great uncertainty and fear across these lands, the staff of the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre want to thank you and all our friends in the international community for your deep concern and support.

You will be seeing and hearing through your newsfeeds and connections about the new and formidable challenges that we are all facing here.

The news is indeed grave. However, we are assessing the risks needed to operate in this emergency situation, and we want to bring you a different kind of news to that which is now filling all our screens.

Today, in Jerusalem our centre on the Mount of Olives is fully open. Although our West Bank staff have had long journeys to work, with their special medical permission they can still access Jerusalem at a time when many Palestinians cannot.

More remarkably, this week a number of families from the West Bank who were referred through our Outreach Program, have been able to reach us to enrol on our residential Child Rehabilitation and Mother and Family Empowerment Program.

We are pleased to say that today we have an occupancy rate of 45% in the Mother and Child Dormitory, of families who have travelled from across the West Bank. We ensure that in addition to their day time schedule, they have access to 24hour care and a protective space within our building. Our Inclusive School, on the directive of the Ministry of Education, like other schools, is closed for this week and we await further notice.

In Gaza our staff are working at full capacity.

They are now a team of 8 staff, having recently been joined by a new playworker to increase psychosocial provision.

Today our Social Worker in Gaza spoke to us and said,

"Everybody is busy in therapeutic rooms. We are developing the services further because of the immense needs in our own emergency situation. Although communication for us outside of Gaza is even harder, with maybe 90% of the network down, we are doing our best for our children and families." Our Jerusalem-based team continues to find ways to stay connected and support our colleagues in Gaza. In a powerful display of resilience and solidarity, we are now experiencing a deepening sense of mutual support. Our Gaza staff, despite the extreme circumstances they face, are also offering us encouragement and advice as the situation in Jerusalem becomes increasingly difficult.

This is an everchanging, ever-challenging situation, and so we especially value your support in whatever way you are able, through your words of solidarity, your prayers and your giving.

This comes with our thanks, as we all endeavour to be the light where we are.

we cry out to you in the midst of the pain and trauma of violence and fear which prevails in the Holy Land.


Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.

**GROW COURSES** offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.

### News from Holy Cross, Crediton



Members of the congregation at Holy Cross joined with all the other churches in Crediton to sing Songs of Praise in Newcombes Meadow on Sunday 1 June. We were accompanied by Crediton Town Band with representatives from each of the churches leading the worship.

Two days later, the Venerable Moira Astin was announced as the new Bishop of Crediton. She is currently the Archdeacon of Reigate in Southwark Diocese, a role she has held for nine years. On the day of the announcement, Moira visited a number of locations from North to East Devon and was in Crediton for lunch with the local Ministry team and women clergy from across the Diocese. As you can see from the photo, she popped into Holy Cross and had the chance to come face-to-face with Boniface's statue. Moira will be consecrated a bishop on 3 July at Southwark Cathedral by the Bishop of London (and former Bishop of Crediton), the Rt. Rev'd Sarah Mulally. There will be a Service of Welcome and Installation for her at Exeter Cathedral on Sunday 6 July at 4pm, which all are welcome to attend.
