THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

August and September 2025

This 'thought' comes in two parts: The first thought comes from an article entitled "Wisdom of the Elders" in connection with the event known as The Miracle on the Hudson. (Printed in AARP May-June 2009)

A few months after the crash, Captain Sullenberger, while being interviewed by the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) Magazine, was asked how he was able to execute a nearly perfect water landing. He replied, "One way of looking at this might be that for 42

years, I've been making small, regular deposits in this bank of experience, education and training. And on January 15th 2009, the balance was sufficient so that I could make a very large withdrawal."

The Bible speaks a great deal about true perception (seeing) and true understanding (hearing)

Read Isaiah 6 v. 9 - 10 and then Matthew 13 v. 1 - 17, where Jesus is explaining the Parable of the Sower to his disciples and telling them that they are blessed because the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been shown to them

Captain Sully is someone who understood the need to sow quietly and diligently, during his long career as an airline pilot: and the miracle was the harvest, the fruit of those four decades.

There was no warning that the harvest was imminent: when the plane took off it was a routine flight, but within a very short time great clarity of thought and purpose were needed. How grateful we are to those who live their lives with that kind of far-reaching perspective.

My second thought comes from one of my best friends (R.)who wrote a poem on the tenth anniversary of having her second eye removed (due to cancer): the total loss of physical sight was replaced by intense inner sight and the gift of healing and helping many through her hands, but nevertheless the bereavement is all too real:

From R. "10 years ago today I had my second eye removed. Some things in life are so final that life will forever be different."

Goodbye.

As if you were Medusa, they said don't look. Not directly, for your beauty is too great. Your light too powerful for human eyes. But I wish I'd looked before it was too late.

There are times when i play back in my memory.
Where your evening curtain call would paint the sky.
And your morning glow would shine to shift man's hearts.
But I knew not then I'd have to say goodbye.

If I'd known then, would I, should I have revelled more?
And paid homage to your timeless, selfless gaze.
Unworried by histories changing landscapes.
With detached acceptance, marking out the days.
I cannot even remember the moment.
When I looked and you were nowhere to be seen.

And though I know your presence shines for others. I so deeply miss your light which shone serene.

Like Captain Sully, R. has saved many including my own life

But in some respects, the smooth-talking voiceover artist is correct. In life, as well as on the roads many of us travel daily, the best way to cope with unexpected obstacles is not to 'fight it but to feel it'. We can either rush around beeping our horns whilst dashing along new found rat runs (only to discover that Google Maps has told the whole world about them) or decide to go with the flow no matter how slow and meandering it may be.

The same goes for our relationships with those around us. Yes, there are times in our lives when urgent action is required and we need to gird up our loins, as did Thomas Clarkson the most famous resident of Playford. But there are also times when it really doesn't matter if we arrive ten, fifteen, or twenty minutes late. It matters most that we arrive in our right mind and able to be the best person we can be for those amongst whom we live.

During the Covid lockdowns I was given special permission to be out and about on the roads as some of the work I was doing was deemed to be an essential service. It felt weird to be driving along an almost empty A14 and the boy racer inside me thought, 'Right, now is the time to push the pedal to the metal'. But I didn't. Instead, I travelled, and still do, at 55mph instead of 70mph. Yes, it meant that I added about ten minutes to each hour I drove, but I also added some much-needed peace and harmony to the journey and to the task with which I was charged.

Christians follow Jesus, who did all his miracles and spoke all his words whilst walking at just three miles an hour. Can any of us gain anything by being irritated when we can't travel at a faster speed than did the Son of God?

SUNSET AND A SNIFTER

Each year the Ipswich branch of the Merchant Navy Association gathers on 3 September to mark Merchant Navy Day. It was on 3 September 1939, the day the Second World War commenced, that the first casualties, torpedoed by a German U-Boat, the passengers and crew of SS Athenia. In all 128 perished with over 1200 needing to be rescued



All across our land Town Council Offices by Royal Command, will raise the Red Ensign, known as the Red Duster by 'them that go down to the sea in ships', in honour of those who have sailed upon the mighty waters since then. Too many of whom have Davy Jones' Locker as their final resting place.

There will be a formal ceremony and wreath laying at the Merchant Navy War Memorial on Orwell Quay in Ipswich at 10.30 on the morning of 3 September. Then at 5pm in the evening the Association and friends will gather around the flagpole at our war memorial in Kesgrave for a brief Sunset Ceremony and the lowering of the ensign.

After this we will 'splice the mainbrace' and toast all our shipmates, those at home, those on the sea, and those who have crossed the Bar. All are welcome and the drinks are free. However if you would like to bring your own grog to share with others you would be even more welcome.


SILVER GROUPS

First and foremost, a huge thank you to those who responded to our appeal in the *Kesgrave In Touch* magazine and to those who sponsored me on the "Orwell Walk".

As a church we face two major challenges: One, to replace the church boiler and two, to make a significant contribution towards the ongoing costs of ministry: this is known as the Parish Share and represents the cost of ministry across the whole of the diocese (over 400 parishes) We need 149 people to give £200 between now and December 31st **OR** gifts of any size given regularly through the Parish Giving Scheme https://bit.ly/4mINTWz

We are pleased to be given the opportunity to Record All Saints Church Kesgrave and are looking forward to starting work in September.

Who are the Church Recorders?

The Parish Churches of Suffolk contain hundreds, or even a thousand years of living history. Most members of the local communities and visitors are, however, only aware of a fraction of their significance.

Churches house important treasures and display a huge wealth of human creativity. With this in mind, Church Recording was launched in 1973 by NADFAS, now known as The Arts Society, in a response to a challenge by the Victoria and Albert Museum: - 'would it be possible for groups of volunteers to acquire the expertise to record and archive artefacts inside Churches to a professional standard.' Since then, dedicated Recorders have documented more than 2,000 Churches across the country.

A Church Record contains detailed descriptions, relevant history, photographs, plans and, in some cases, drawings of everything that is found within the Church. This comprises the furniture, furnishings and internal fabric, and includes sections on Memorials, Metalwork, Stonework, Woodwork, Textiles, Paintings, Library and Windows. In many cases, these have never been catalogued.

The Church Records represents not only an extensive catalogue of the Church contents but also a fascinating social history of the local area and its people over the centuries.

Churches use their Church Records to better understand and promote the treasures they contain, to write or improve their Guidebooks, inventories, grant applications and, sadly following burglaries, to provide details for police and insurers. The importance of the work is recognised in that copies of the Record are deposited with Historic England, the V&A Art Library, the Church Care Library and the local Record Office, for us, The Hold in Ipswich.

The cost of producing the Church Record is generously sponsored by The Arts Societies' South East Suffolk (Ipswich) and Woodbridge.

We are a lively Church Recording group made up of members from The Arts Societies of Woodbridge, South East Suffolk and Supporters.

We plan to start in September and will be meeting at the Church on the second and fourth Wednesday of the month 10am to 12 pm.
