

of VJ Day on Friday 15th August with a Service of Commemoration in All Saints, Braishfield at 7.00pm, for the whole benefice.

What is remembered on VJ Day?

Victory over Japan Day, also known as VJ Day, is an important date in history – marking the end of the Second World War. Without the brave sacrifices of those who fought in the campaign in the Far East we would not have the way of life and freedoms we enjoy today. We recognise and pay tribute to them on VJ Day.

On 8 May 1945, the end of the war in Europe was marked – known as Victory in Europe Day. Following this end of fighting, the UK, US, France and USSR - otherwise known as the Allies – gave Japan a deadline of 26 July to also stop. An estimated 71,000 service personnel from the UK and the Commonwealth died fighting the Japanese. This included 12,000 people who perished in a prisoner of war camp. The deadline passed without any sign of peace. This prompted the US President Harry Truman to make the decision for the US to drop the atomic bomb on two Japanese cities – Hiroshima on 6 August and Nagasaki on 9 August. Around 214,000 people were killed in the blasts and Japan was forced to surrender.

15 August 1945 marked the end of the Second World War and is known in the UK as VJ Day. British Prime Minister Clement Attlee announced two days of national holiday on 15 and 16 August to celebrate the end of fighting. All over the world there were street parties and parades.

This was a bitter-sweet time, however. The happiness felt because of the war being over and the Allies being victorious, was accompanied by sadness. Millions of people had died in the global conflict and many veterans and civilians were left with physical and mental trauma. (Information from 'Help for Heroes' website.)



Something to think about....

Have you heard of Earth Overshoot Day? It's the date when humanity's demand on nature surpasses our Earth's capacity to replenish nature during the entire year. Calculated by Global Footprint Network, the international sustainability organization that pioneered the Ecological Footprint, this date is based on the National Footprint and Biocapacity Accounts maintained by York University.

Back in 1971 we were just about 'breaking even' - using in a year only what could be replenished in a year - see the table below. This year, Earth Overshoot Day fell on 24th July.



Earth Overshoot Day falling on July 24th means that humanity is currently using nature 1.8 times faster than Earth's ecosystems can regenerate. The overshoot occurs because people emit more CO₂ than the biosphere can absorb, use more freshwater than is replenished, harvest more trees than can regrow, fish quicker than stocks replenish, etc.

But our small individual efforts to reduce/re-use/recycle make a difference. It's good to see that the date of Overshoot Day is flattening out - now to push it to later in the year? More info at *Global Footprint Network www.footprintnetwork.org*.


