Luke 11.1-13

In this passage, Luke introduces us to some concepts about prayer and God. The first four verses of Chapter 11 are Luke's version of what we now recognise as the Lord's prayer, although this should be seen rather as a template on how to pray, with each line being a theme to adopt when praying to God. Acknowledging God's holiness is followed by a desire for God's kingdom to come on earth. Acknowledging our need for sustenance and shelter is the next subject, and this leads on to a confession of our need to be forgiven, and from that our need to forgive others. Trials can come in many shapes and forms, spiritual, mental and physical, and we are encouraged to pray to avoid them, and where that is not possible the strength to endure them. The passage then moves on to consider our attitude to prayer, so be persistent says Jesus. The man in the story gets what he needs through persistency against a wall of indifference. Luke concludes this passage with Jesus reminding us that we who are parents don't give bad things to our children, only good, so don't expect anything less from God. Mike Hammond



Bible Readings: Sunday 27th July Sixth Sunday after Trinity

Genesis 18.20-32

20 Then the Lord said, 'How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin!
21 I must go down and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me; and if not, I will know.'

- 22 So the men turned from there, and went towards Sodom, while Abraham remained standing before the Lord.
- 23 Then Abraham came near and said, 'Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked?
- 24 Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it?
- 25 Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?'
- 26 And the Lord said, 'If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will forgive the whole place for their sake.'
- 27 Abraham answered, 'Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes.
- 28 Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking? Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?' And he said, 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there.'
- 29 Again he spoke to him, 'Suppose forty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of forty I will not do it.'
- 30 Then he said, 'Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak. Suppose thirty are found there.' He answered, 'I will not do it, if I find thirty there.'
- 31 He said, 'Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it.'
- 32 Then he said, 'Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of ten I will not destroy it.'

Colossians 2.6-15 16-19

6 As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him,

7 rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. 8 See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ.

9 For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, 10 and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority.

11 In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ;

- 12 when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead.
- 13 And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses,
- 14 erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross.
- 15 He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.
- [16 Therefore do not let anyone condemn you in matters of food and drink or of observing festivals, new moons, or sabbaths.
- 17 These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the substance belongs to Christ.
- 18 Do not let anyone disqualify you, insisting on self-abasement and worship of angels, dwelling on visions, puffed up without cause by a human way of thinking, 19 and not holding fast to the head, from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows with a growth that is from God.]

Luke 11.1-13

11 He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.'

2 He said to them, 'When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

- 3 Give us each day our daily bread.
- 4 And forgive us our sins,

for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.'

- 5 And he said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, "Friend, lend me three loaves of bread;
- 6 for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him."
- 7 And he answers from within, "Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything."
- 8 I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.
- 9 'So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you.
- 10 For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.
- 11 Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish?
- 12 Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion?
- 13 If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

The Foodbank has **MOST URGENT NEED of:**Hot dogs, Jam, Meatballs, Peanut butter, Custard **They also need:**

UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Biscuits, Tinned vegetarian meals e.g. veggie chilli, Sweets, snacks, crisps and cereal bars, Orange squash, Fruit juice, Sugar (500g), Dried potatoes (Smash), Crackers, Tinned sweetcorn, Tinned carrots, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned peas, Tinned ham, Pasta sauce, Tinned red meat, such as mince, Bolognese, stew, chilli, Fray Bentos pies, Sandwich paste, Tinned fruit, Chicken in sauce, Teabags, Cup of Soup, Tinned potatoes, Sugar (500g), Cup of soup, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Sponge puddings, Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

NEW: Cathedral Civic Service to Mark the 80th Anniversary of VJ Day



A special reflective service will take place at Leicester Cathedral at 5.30pm on Thursday 14th August to mark the 80th anniversary of VJ (Victory over Japan) and the end of the Second World War

Held on the eve of the anniversary, the service will offer space for remembrance and reflection on the end of the Second World War, which came just days after the devastating atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Members of the public are invited to attend the service, which invites people to pause and consider the ongoing instability of the world, the continued proliferation of nuclear weapons, and the deep and enduring need for peace.

Lord-Lieutenant of Leicestershire, Mike Kapur OBE CstJ, said: "Marking the 80th anniversary of VJ Day gives us an opportunity to reflect not only on the end of one of the darkest chapters in our history, but also on the sacrifices made by so many, including those from Leicester and Leicestershire. It is vital that we remember the past in order to build a more peaceful future."

The service will include prayers, readings and moments of silence, offering a quiet and powerful tribute to those affected by the war and its aftermath.

STOMP Round Leicester



Leicester Cathedral is one of many city centre locations hosting magnificent elephant sculptures as part of the STOMP Round Leicester art trail, raising vital funds for LOROS Hospice and marking its 40th anniversary.

Forty gentle giants have journeyed into Leicester's streets, parks and open spaces, forming a jumbo trail across the city **until Sunday 21 September**.

The Cathedral is home to a mini-herd of baby elephant sculptures, adopted and decorated by local schools and community groups.

When the trail ends, the baby elephants will stomp back to join their owners, while the giant elephant sculptures will be auctioned on Wednesday 8 October to raise money for the hospice, which helps terminally ill local people and their families at the most difficult times of their lives.
