















## Don & Glynn will be hosting groups

## **PETITION**

## Require recycling facilities for blister packs in all dispensaries and chemists

We have finally got approval from the House of Commons for our petition to require all dispensaries and chemists to offer a bin for recycling blister packs.

We have been offering a recycling service for a few years now but the take up is over-whelming and our thoughts are that just relying on big branches of Boots and Superdrug to offer this service isn't really taking the service to the greatest point of need. Most people collect their prescriptions (Or have them collected for them) from much more local outlets and the incentive to recycle would be much enhanced if people could drop off blister packs at the point where they normally collect them.

As we have seen in our own church porch, the amount of blister packs in use these days is truly staggering and the thought of most of them ending up in landfill is quite horrifying.

I hope you don't mind us asking you to sign this petition which the St Mary's Creation Matters team has approved and hopefully circulating it amongst as many others as possible.

It's great to be able to share a good news story with you, our vital and faithful supporters. You may indeed have already read the article in the NWN last week about the success of the Hungry Holidays initiative, but if not, I have attached a scanned copy. The scheme provided food and essential items during the school holidays to 1,152 children from 474 households across 47 schools. The detailed planning and organisation which started in March, the financial support from West Berkshire Council and Greenham Trust, corporate volunteers who offered their help and an army of willing volunteers resulted in the deliveries all being completed a week ahead of schedule. Fantastic!

However, there's always another side to the story. The donations this year from March to July totalled 34,056kgs compared to 39,863kgs in 2024, so more stock had to be purchased – 19,640kgs compared to 15,112kgs in 2024. The financial support was crucial for this. In June and July, the weight of purchased stock was

almost equal to the weight of donations. It's not surprising that the result is that the stock level in the warehouse has fallen to approx. 20,000kgs despite almost the same amount having been purchased! To be able to continue to offer help to those who are facing difficulties this winter, the stock levels need to be built up again.

So please would you consider supporting the Foodbank this Harvest? We really need your help and support to spread the good news about the success of the Hungry Holidays initiative but also the impact that this has had on our stock levels.


