


MARCH 2025 NEWSLETTER

Can you help?

What is a Foundation Governor?

Foundation governors have the same core objectives as any other member of the governing body. In addition THEY have a special role in, and responsibility for, ensuring that the Christian Character of a Church of England School is secured, preserved and developed and that the school is run in accordance with any trust deed relating to the school.

Requirements:

There are only two requirements to be a Foundation Governor. One is that you're over the age of 18 and the second that you are a practising Christian.

There's not a specific 'person specification' when it comes to the other skills you need, suffice to say all governing bodies need a wide range of people sitting on them.


