Welcome to this Harvest edition of the Maunder. I think we have had our fair share of summer heat this year, which I think is probably down to climate change. This recent heat has certainly affected our garden even with some regular, but not excessive watering. We have lost 2 of our well established and what I thought were healthy roses, suddenly in mid august. We also lost a lot of spring planted perennials, despite watering, they just dried up and bore no roots. This unusually hot weather has also affected our apple trees, the apples are ready to pick now in mid august and had shed several hundred apples and are nowhere near their normal size. Lets see what happens next year. We had a local bee society install a bee hive last April in a concealed area of our south churchvard. We were saddened to hear that at the end of July, they were attacked by wasps and after killing many, the rest and the queen were driven out. There were not enough bees to fight the wasps off, shame but lets hope a new colony next year will do well with some alterations to the hive to prevent wasps entering. See you next month.

Once again we reach the season of harvest, with our festival services. This is traditionally a time to celebrate God s gift of an earth that provides for our needs. However, as well as being a time to enjoy the abundance of God's provisions to us in our part of the world, this is also a time that should reawaken our concern for the world's poor - for those whose harvests have failed or who, for whatever reason, do not enjoy the earth's fruits in security as we do.

At harvest time it is right for us to offer our thanks to God for his goodness, but it is essential that we also recognise our need to repent for the human betraval of God's gift to us in creation. It is right that we seek God's forgiveness for the way the world fails to ensure a just distribution of its food and water supplies. CRYPTOGRAM


Now the children are back at school and the holiday season is over it's time to get the old grey matter working again. In the puzzle below each letter represents another letter of the alphabet. Start by looking for Common Letters: the most common letters in the English language are E, T, A, O, and N, with I and S a close second. So, the first step to solving the puzzle is to look at what letters occur most often in the grid. Then try to solve the **Short Words**, this is especially effective for short words that have only two or three letters. OF, TO, IN, IS, IT, AS, HE, BE, BY, ON, OR, and AT. Followed by 3 Letter Words: AND and THE lead the list, with FOR, HIS, NOT, BUT, YOU, ARE, HER, and HAD. Then try to Spot the Repeated Letters: RR, LL, NN, MM, and fewer of these are in small words. So if there is a three-letter word containing repeating letter, such as SZZ, that word could be the word ALL. Another very common pattern is the letters TH – appearing in both THE and THAT, as well as THIS, THOSE, THEM, and more.


