I would like to take this opportunity to express my deepest gratitude for the extraordinary gift of a sabbatical. A sabbatical is far more than a holiday or a pause from duties; it is an invitation for rest, renewal, and rediscovery. A chance to listen afresh to God, to my own heart, and to the needs of the community to which I am called. For all of this, and for the trust that has been extended to me, I say thank you. Ministry, like any vocation, requires energy, imagination, and resilience. These cannot be endlessly poured out without being replenished. You have given me time to breathe more deeply, to read more widely, and to pray with greater stillness. You have shown me that you care not only about the tasks I perform, but also about the person I am. Thank you for the kindness and generosity that lies behind this decision. It requires rearrangement of duties, the willingness of others to step forward, and the patience to accept that routines will shift. I am deeply conscious that my colleagues and co-leaders have taken on additional responsibilities so that I might step away for a season. Their willingness to do so is a gift of love and solidarity. I am grateful to each person who has said "yes" to filling the gaps, carrying the extra load, or offering encouragement along the way. During this sabbatical I have had space to explore interests and questions that are difficult to address in the busyness of daily life. I've spent some time with the brothers at the Community of the Resurrection in Mirfield, stayed at the Anglican Centre in Rome and at Cuddesdon, an Anglican College in Oxford. I have been able to read slowly, not just for sermon preparation and to spend some time in prayer and reflection without glancing at the clock. I have been able to attend retreats, explore new places, and encounter God in unexpected ways. These are treasures that will not only bless me but, I hope, will overflow into the ministry I share with you. Thank you for giving me the freedom to pursue them. I've travelled to Vigo, Barcelona, Valencia, Toulon, Florence, Rome, Algero. By stepping aside for this time, I have been reminded that rest is not an indulgence but an essential rhythm of life. The sabbatical has given me permission to stop, to let go, to trust that the world continues to turn even when I am not busy. Thank you, too, for recognising the need for imagination. A sabbatical is not simply about recovery; it is about possibility. It has given me room to ask questions such as: What might the next chapter of ministry look like? Where is God calling us as a community? How can I grow in wisdom, compassion, and skill so that I may serve more faithfully? These are not questions that can be answered in haste. They require time, quiet, and openness. Your gift of sabbatical has provided exactly that environment. I also wish to thank you for the support that you have given during this time, reminding me that the sabbatical is not a solitary venture but a shared journey. I may have stepped aside from daily duties, but I have not stepped away from community. As I return from this time away, I do so with a renewed sense of gratitude and a refreshed sense of calling. The sabbatical has not distanced me from ministry; rather, it has deepened my love for it. It has reminded me why I was drawn to this path in the first place. It has rekindled joy, sharpened focus, and restored hope. These are gifts I bring back with me, and I offer them freely in service to the community. **Father Gareth**



Local registered charity Making Miracles is pleased to announce this year's annual Big Knit at Rochester <u>Cathedral</u> and we would like to invite as many people as able to attend the event on Saturday 11 October from 10am to 1pm.

As a local charity we provide baby loss support and services to all families across Kent and Medway who lose a baby and monies we make from selling items knitted fund our really important services like professional bereavement and trauma counselling so that at such a tragic time in their lives those families are getting the help

they need without having to worry about costs as all our services are free.

We encourage as many people as possible between now and then to make squares which they can make up into blankets themselves or let us have on the day for other knitters to sew into squares for us. The morning is lots of fun with us always trying to make more squares than the previous years. Squares should be 6x6 inches each and we ask people to bring any they have been able to make before as well if they would like to and bring in a bag so that we can put those knitted by one person into the same blanket...The most popular colours are pastel pinks, blues, greys and white but we are happy to take all squares made.

The finished blankets are then sold on our community stalls and in our shops "Handmade with Love" with every penny raised funding our bereavement services for families who lose a baby.

Making Miracles is also really proud of what local volunteers make for us so at this year's event we will also be showcasing lots of items that have been made and kindly donated to us to sell to raise much needed funds. Included in this showcase event will be wooden items made and donated to us by the prisoners in Maidstone Prison, with whom we have a unique partnership.

It would be lovely for people to also visit us on the day and learn more about what we do.
