Please be aware that the Recreational Area is not an area for the exercise of dogs. The Parish Council recently highlighted this with appropriate signage and we would like to thank all responsible dog owners who have respected this. This article is for the benefit of anyone who was unaware of this.

We encourage dog owners to find alternative places to exercise their dogs and please clear up any dog litter which is a requirement of the England and Wales under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996. Thank you for your cooperation.

Natural Environment Committee Kathryn Nolan & Jo Fell write...

Our focus over the coming year is to encourage pollinators in our gardens and village spaces. By introducing plants that provide food sources for pollinators we can support these vital insects.

To encourage wildlife during an autumn garden tidy, focus on providing shelter and food sources. Instead of a complete cutback, leave some plants uncut, especially those with seedheads and hollow stems which provide food sources for birds and over

wintering sites for insects. Create piles of leaves and debris in sheltered areas. These provide essential habitats and food for insects, birds, and small mammals like hedgehogs.

Finally, a date for your diary, on 4th October the NEC will be meeting at the village pond to remove unwanted vegetation such as small tree saplings and purple loosestrife which are starting to encroach across the pond. Volunteers to join the working party would be very welcome – please watch the village social media sites for further details.

A Word from Our Vicar

Dear Friends,

I was reflecting lately about the church in our village, comparing it with many other churches that I know and I wondered, what would we be doing if we didn't have buildings?

Before you lynch me, this is of course a hypothetical question. We do have the most amazing building in the heart of our village. People come from far and wide to look at it. It has been around for over 800 years and I would hope will be here in another 800 years. I raise the question because I was reflecting on the disjoin between the church as a building and the church as a gathered community of believers in worship.

I suspect that one of the reasons we have church building is for protection (usually from the weather in our country). In some countries it may be from attack. Even in our country, I suspect we have buildings because they offer security in the sense that the community can gather together in one place – people of like mind supporting one another. We all know that is why we join groups, but similarly our families (a small group) can provide security for those who are a part of it.

In the bible, the Apostle Peter refers to Christians as living stones, along with Jesus - 4 As you come to him, the living Stone - rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him - 5 you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house [a] to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

1 Peter 2:4-5

As such those who gather are built together into a spiritual house, a church, a gathering of believers. Early Christians met in front rooms, under trees and in public buildings. In England especially we tend to have elaborate buildings, reflecting the glory of God. However, as we see in our own village a church can simply meet in the village hall.

What is important is that people gather together, share together, experience the ups and downs of life together and work together to serve God and the community. That is what true church is all about.
