#### FEBRUARY 2025 NEWSLETTER

Welcome to our monthly newsletter, which we hope will keep you informed of what's happening in our parish life, the community and also more widely.

Well 2025 has well and truly begun and here we are already issuing our February Newsletter! Normally at this time of the year we would be looking ahead to Lent, however as Easter is fairly late this year (20th April) Lent only begins in March rather than the more usual month of February.

Our year started well with the return of our Bump's, Babies and Toddler group as we celebrated its first anniversary. My grateful thanks to the wonderful members of the team who resourced and supported it throughout 2024. Life changes however as we all know well, and several members have stepped back for various reasons. We would love to have more team members as we are somewhat overstretched currently, so please see the information on page (\*\*) and get in touch if you might like to join our team.

For me this is a month of hectic organisation, as I make sure everything is in place for my Sabbatical which starts from 1st March through to 31st May. A sabbatical is very biblical of course and is rooted in the command for a 'sabbath' day of rest. Leviticus 25 further describes a 'sabbath year', every 7 years for the land and people, though we clergy only have 3 months sabbatical, and in this Diocese unlike others, every 10 years not 7.

I am really looking forward to this time of retreat, rest and renewal. My sabbatical starts with an 8 day silent Retreat up in North Wales in one of my favourite places for retreat (St Beuno's). Catching up with family and friends is a key feature of sabbaticals, and we particularly look forward to a 5 week trip to Australia to see our daughters family.

I'm also looking forward to catching up on sewing and gardening and lots of rest too! Rest is so important for us all and the words of Psalm 23 spring to mind for me and the promise of rest in the lord, with my soul being restored sounds truly wonderful! It is important to note that I am still entitled to my annual 6 weeks in addition to my sabbatical so it will be a year when I will be available much less than normal.

Please be aware that I will not be contactable at all during this time and neither will Wayne be worshipping at St Mary's as we intend to spend the majority of the time together, apart from my retreat. The churchwardens are in charge for any queries and Colin was appointed as a 'deputy churchwarden' at our January PCC for the remainder of the year, to assist Mike and Alison. All the services will be covered by visiting clergy, including several familiar faces and PCC members are aware of all the other arrangements which will have been put in place by then. We have such a wonderful church community and I'm confident you will all support and encourage one another through the 3 months of my sabbatical. Be assured of my prayers for you all and may you also be richly blessed in these upcoming months.



#### Plentiful podcasts!

Whilst the weather is icy, why not curl up indoors with a cuppa and a podcast? Try...

A Rocha International's Field Notes

#### Biodiversity action of the month

In January the RSPB run the <u>Big Garden Birdwatch</u> citizen science survey. Spend an hour watching between 24–26 January. The data gathered each year is valuable to monitor species trends. Take part in your own garden and/or in your churchyard. There is also a <u>Big Schools Birdwatch</u> from 7 January – 14 February.

Also think about providing spring flowers for food for the invertebrates likely to emerge, hungry, in early spring. The following are particularly helpful: dandelions (no need to weed the lawn!), wallflowers, pulmonaria, hawthorn and crab apple. Detailed guidance is available: <u>Take action for insects</u>.

#### **BBOWT** campaign

The Berks, Bucks and Oxon Wildlife Trust are asking us to write to our MPs about increasing protection for chalk streams, one of the rarest habitats on earth. For more information see <u>Save our Chalk Streams</u>.

#### And finally...

If you can't get outside to enjoy God's creation currently, or struggle with the dark of winter, three short <u>films from Plantlife</u> provide virtual exploring and relaxation opportunities. While considering wellbeing, here are <u>nine things</u> to do for both your health and our planet.


