From our Rector, the Revd Jeremy Brading

In 1953 whilst attending Her Majesty the Queen's coronation luncheon at Westminster Hall, Winston Churchill was reported to have remarked "study history, study history; in history lie all the secrets of state craft". To those engaged with 'statecraft' today, August carries with it two sobering moments for reflection.

On 15th August, VJ Day (Victory over Japan) day will be commemorated. In Yoxall, this will take the form of a commemoration thanksgiving service, gathered around the war memorial (6.30pm, 15 August). Whilst planning how to mark this important occasion, I found a photo of Australian servicemen celebrating the news of the Japanese surrender. They were looked forward etc returning home, because these servicemen were prisoners of war. They were incarcerated in a living hell on earth. Such was their experience as prisoners, that this photo shows these servicemen each with severed limbs. Whilst in the camps, evidently they had had to make their own rudimentary prosthetics.

The experience of these men and countless others like them, marks them as survivors of the manic 'total war' that Japan (and Germany) inflicted on the Allies. At the Potsdam Conference (July 1945), it was the lived experience of total war that convinced Churchill, Truman and Stalin to drop the atomic bomb. The first of these detonated over Hiroshima during the morning rush hour on the 6th August 1945. Thus the 6th August 2025, is the second date on which our global politicians should reflect over Churchill's point about state craft. The fact that Churchill's bust once again sits proudly in the Oval Office, may provide a vague source of optimism that this will happen - but only assuming that the current occupant is concerned with warnings from history.

For quite different reasons, the 6th August has always been a significant feast day in the Church. A Feast day, this date celebrates the transfiguration of Jesus, which in turn is recorded by the synoptic Gospels (Matthew 17:1–8, Mark 9:2–13, Luke 9:28–36). Atop a mountain, Jesus appearance changes radically. This is witnessed by his inner circle of disciples: Peter, James and John, who see overwhelmingly bright rays of lights emitting from Jesus' person. Furthermore they witness the Old Testament figures Moses (representing the Torah or Law) and Elijah (presenting all the prophets) in conversation with Jesus.

This significance of this event, is that for the first time, Jesus' full divinity is made obvious. Further more, this promises something new concerning the possibility of a close relationship with God. Until this point in time, the biblical teaching of theophany dictated that any person looking directly at God, would die. What the transfiguration tells us is that through Jesus, we can be present in the midst of the theophany of God's overwhelming presence. We are able to look on one another differently, because our common ancestry in God is revealed in he person of Jesus. If we can demonstrate any learning at all from the events considered on the 6th and 15th August, then surely we need to redouble our efforts as a global society to look at what we share in common, and be thankful for those things.

Chanteuse choir was amazing. The choir filled the church with people enjoying the beautiful voices and the country music had people



Link up bus - update!

The link up bus service pilot sponsored by Lichfield District Council has been extended until November from its original six-month trial which began in January this year. The bus is available between 9 am and 5 pm Mondays to Saturdays until the end of October and costs £3 or for children under 11 and seniors the service is free.

It can be booked up to 7 days in advance, using the LinkUp app or by phone on (0808) 134 6632.

It is an On-Demand bus service available for some villages in the district that lack their own scheduled bus service.

The bus is modern fitted with seatbelts, a large luggage area and charging points by each seat for mobile phones. If you register for an account and download the app providing a mobile phone number, on the day of travel you will get updates giving the bus's estimated pickup time and a text giving notice of the bus's imminent arrival.

The service is cheap and avoids the need to find and pay for parking in town or any other destination within the district. My first journeys were on schedule and convenient. Latterly the bus was quite late, albeit regular updates warned of delay.

The pick up in Hamstall is from the wooden bus stop in Lichfield Road and the set down in Lichfield is at the central bus station. It is a useful rural resource but is a case of **use it or lose it**. If you can make it work but haven't tried it yet, it's worth a go to save on travel costs, including finding parking and to enjoy the view while being driven by somebody else!

Further Church Repairs

The church has recently completed further repair and restoration work to the masonry. This follows its categorisation as urgent within the five yearly survey carried out by the church architect last year. The work focused on the north aisle at both the western and the eastern ends. Heavily weathered stone – some of it probably original 14th century masonry – was cut out and replaced with local Hollington stone. Joints were set and pointed using traditional lime mortar. All this work comes at a cost however, and for both ends of the aisle the total bill on this occasion was £4500.

We were most fortunate in securing some help with the costs of this work from the Staffordshire Historic Churches Trust* who have been kind enough to help us in the past, and also Lasletts Charity. The latter is a Worcestershire-based charity.

Lasletts Charity. The latter is a Worcestershire-based charity, which includes Anglican parish churches amongst those it is prepared to assist.

Nevertheless, this essential work is a significant drain on church resources, which must now also look ahead to further essential work to the north eaves of the north aisle, and also to each of the North aisle buttresses. We are also glad to again acknowledge the skilled work of our mason, Paul Beardsmore.


