I can't believe that we're finally at the end of our journey together. I want to thank you all so much for all your care and support for me and my family over the last 9 months. We will miss you!

This summer at New Wine some friends were asking one another "what's your one sermon in a sentence?" Essentially, what's the thing that matters most to you about God, the Bible, faith, discipleship that you would preach if you were suddenly asked to do so last minute?

Instantly my response was "Jesus came to live, and show us how to live, not just to die." Sometimes we as Christians in the UK can get so laser focused on the cross that we forget the other 33 years of his life.

Of course, it is incredibly important that Jesus died and rose again - and absolutely everything that it represents (the defeat of death and evil on a cosmological level!).

But he also showed us ways to bring heaven to earth and defeat evil one small act and thought at a time. Through asking us to live like the upside-down kingdom of heaven, where the greatest serves the least rather than lording over others.



Where the peace makers are blessed, those who hunger and thirst for the right treatment of others will be filled, where the poor have the keys to the kingdom and the rich are sent away empty handed. Where women are invited to sit and learn with the men and children are there to teach the adults. Where loving God and loving others including our "enemies" are the greatest commandments. Where instead of judging others we are invited to self-reflection and improvement transformation through the transforming and renewal of our minds by the power of the holy spirit. Where all are welcome to feast at his table and the stone(s) (people!) that people rejected have become the capstone.

I'm a broken world Jesus could have come with pomp and ceremony, yet he chose to wash the feet of his friends, like a servant instead. By choosing the way of Jesus through spending time with him, being like him and doing what he did we actively show others and bring glimpses of the kingdom of heaven here on earth and continues to stand against evil the way Jesus did and does.

So, whilst we thank God for his wonderful sacrifice, we thank him even more that he's the kind of God who cares enough to do so. To call us friends instead of slaves and expect the same of us towards others. Jesus came not just to die but to live and to show us how to live. To bring life and life to the full. Thank you, Jesus!

MOST FOOD BANKS ARE CURRENTLY SHORT OF FOOD

This happens most summers, but each year seems to get worse.

IF YOU SUPPORT A FOOD BANK. Thank you for responding to the need. However, please consider encouraging people to donate NOW. With people away on holidays and Harvest Festivals often in October, food banks can struggle over the summer and early autumn.

IF YOU DON'T ALREADY SUPPORT A FOODBANK. Please can you help us?

Our city is still above the national average for child poverty – over 1 in 3 children in Derby are living in poverty. I don't need to tell you that churches are major supporters of food banks: "When I was hungry you fed me"

Please would you consider supporting **DERBY FOOD 4 THOUGHT FOOD BABK ALLIANCE.** This is the charity where I volunteer, and I have never seen our warehouse shelves so empty. We help with the supply of food to 17 food banks across the city. They can put in an order to us for those items they need, and we can be of special support to the smaller or newer or less well-known foodbanks. Incidentally, occasionally, we can also redistribute donations if for example a food bank has been given a large quantity of an item they cannot house or comfortably use. We also support food parcels to individuals and families, and through our partner agencies, to the homeless and people leaving hospital.

What do we need? Long dated tins- meat, fish, potatoes, vegetables, soup, rice pudding, fruit, pasta, rice, biscuits, squash or pasta/noodles which need only kettle or microwave. There is a full list on the website

DF4TA have other projects like collecting and distributing school uniform and now have a furniture project. The website is derbyfood4thoughtalliance.org.uk for more information.

SHOPPING STRATEGICALLY

Whether you support a foodbank in church or give to instore collections, shopping strategically can be helpful.

Although of course we appreciate baked beans, if you can occasionally afford meat like stew, it's highly valued because fewer people think about donating it. But every food donation, however small, is a plus and will be gratefully received

I'm a person who loves spicy food but non spicy soups etc suit more families.

Tea bags in foil inner packets can be split up and given to more families when supplies are short.

A bottle of squash goes further than a bottle of pop.

Giant packets of cereal can only be given to one family and even single people use food banks. A smaller pack can be just as effective.

Some people only have a kettle to 'cook' with, so pot noodles/and pot porridge have a place.

Please pray for the people who receive the food you give. Thank you for your kindness and generosity.




