I did have a wonderful sabbatical, with time for reflection, prayer, family and friends, and we travelled quite


extensively too. My retreat in North Wales was a delight and unusually for Wales, the weather behaved, and spring was in the air and everywhere around me.




## JUNE'S YOUTH CLUB

## Require recycling facilities for blister packs in all dispensaries and chemists

We have finally got approval from the House of Commons for our petition to require all dispensaries and chemists to offer a bin for recycling blister packs.

We have been offering a recycling service for a few years now but the take up is over-whelming and our thoughts are that just relying on big branches of Boots and Superdrug to offer this service isn't really taking the service to the greatest point of need. Most people collect their prescriptions (Or have them collected for them) from much more local outlets and the incentive to recycle would be much enhanced if people could drop off blister packs at the point where they normally collect them.

As we have seen in our own church porch, the amount of blister packs in use these days is truly staggering and the thought of most of them ending up in landfill is quite horrifying.

I hope you don't mind us asking you to sign this petition which the St Mary's Creation Matters team has approved and hopefully circulating it amongst as many others as possible.



#### Dear Friends,

As we approach the school holidays, families should be looking forward to a time of joy and relaxation. However for many this brings the worry of putting food on the table. When schools close, free school meals stop. For the 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, West Berks Foodbank is addressing this issue with the Hungry Holidays project. 87 Schools in West Berkshire, primary and secondary, have been contacted and asked to identify families that they know are going to be struggling over the summer holidays. So far 46 schools have replied (48 in 2024) so we will be providing support to at least 478 households (555 in 2024) with 1026 under 18 year olds (1276



in 2024) — so the this year's figures are very comparable to last year's. The food will be sent to the schools, who will distribute it before the end of term. This is a major undertaking and we really need your support to make it successful. I have included below a graph of the stock in and out for the first 3 months of the year. You can see that the stock in from donations and purchased goods is not matching the stock distributed. Last year the stock sent out in July

alone, which included the Hungry Holidays parcels, totalled 23,000 kgs! With your help, this year's Hungry Holidays project can succeed in supporting all these families. I have attached a list of items that are urgently needed and will email an updated list in a couple of weeks. Please circulate this appeal amongst your church communities and wider if possible. Cash donations are also needed as for the schools with large deliveries, an order will be sent directly from a supermarket paid for by WBF. I conclude with a comment from a grateful family last year:

I received a food delivery today and am so grateful to you all. I can't believe it. It has made me very tearful today.

I can't thank you enough for your generosity and I can't believe how much food I have received for my family. It's going to help so much.

By continuing to work together, we can support those in need and also ensure that no child in West Berkshire goes hungry this summer.




