

# Blackwater Benefice Ministry Team Message



This year so far indicates a record average high temperature in the UK.

At the time of writing, water restrictions in various parts of the country are coming into force. Abberton and West Hanningfield reservoirs in July were reported together as being 84% full. Abberton had a massive increase in capacity in a 20-year project completed in 2015. As more and more people have water meters fitted, overall usage has diminished as people are more aware of the cost. The Government have committed to build nine new reservoirs by 2050.

The early hot weather must have been a challenging time for farmers in the agricultural sector with rain in the southeast coming just in time to help save the crop. As holiday makers pray for sunny weather and farmers for rain, God has a dilemma!

This year we had two serious water leaks at the rear of our cottage, both of which were attended to efficiently by Essex & Suffolk Water who also recommended that we have a meter fitted to read usage. Most homes with just one or two inhabitants make savings.

The water content of the average human body is 60%. We are told to always ensure we keep hydrated, especially in hot weather, sensible advice. Importantly, water regulates our body temperature, protects and moistens the tissues and organs of the body, helps dissolve minerals and nutrients to make them accessible to the body, carries nutrients and oxygen to cells and helps the liver and kidneys to flush out waste.

A lovely episode recorded in the New Testament tells of Jesus, tired, dusty and thirsty, coming to a well for a drink. There he encounters a Samaritan woman whom he engages in conversation. A Jewish man would not normally converse with a female stranger, especially a despised Samaritan woman. It was midday, the hottest time of day when water would not normally be collected. He knows her background but doesn't judge her. She is convinced he is the Messiah. She leaves her water pot, anxious to return to her village to share her story there.

St John quoted Jesus as saying "If a person is thirsty let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me ..... streams of living water will flow from within."

A wonderful metaphor for the life-giving properties of this precious resource without which life on earth would not exist!

# **News from the Belfry**

This summer we went on a day trip to Winchester. This was in fact our second visit. Our first was back in the early 1970s when we went to a Christmas party held at the The City Mill which was then a Youth Hostel. We cycled there on a Saturday from our respective homes in West London and back home the next day, a round trip of 150 miles on a tandem. We must have been very fit in those days! The City Mill is now a visitor attraction managed by the National Trust.

The main attraction in Winchester is the beautiful cathedral, the largest of its kind in northern Europe. Its full name is the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity, St Peter, St Paul and St Swithun, but it is popularly known simply as Winchester Cathedral. It was built between 1079 and 1532. It is noted for having a very long and very wide nave, and its overall length of 558 feet makes it the longest medieval cathedral in the world. It is also the sixth largest cathedral in the United Kingdom. It is fortunate that the cathedral is still standing today. In 1906 it was discovered that the cathedral was sinking due to inadequate foundations, causing flooding. A specialist diver, William Walker from London, was engaged to sort out the problem. He worked for six to seven hours a day in total darkness, wearing a full diving suit, plugging the water that was coming up from below with bags of cement. It took him six years to complete the task. The water could then be safely pumped away.

The bells of the cathedral have rung out since Saxon times. Over the centuries, there have been several changes to the framework in the belfry and to the bells themselves. In 1921, the peal of bells was augmented to 12 with the addition of two new treble bells cast by Gillett and Johnston of Croydon. This gave the Diocese of Winchester its first ring of 12 bells. The bells were dedicated to those who lost their lives in the First World War in Winchester. It was decided in 1936 to have the bells recast in honour of the forthcoming coronation of Edward VIII and they were subsequently removed and returned to Taylors of Loughborough. The bells were then recast between 1st and 28th September. The inscription on the tenor bell read "Edward Octavi". The bells were then returned and rehung in the cathedral. As we all know, Edward abdicated on 11<sup>th</sup> December 1936. The inscription on the bell was hurriedly scratched out and "Georgi Sexti" was etched in by hand.

In 1991 the timbers of the bell chamber were found to be rotten and urgent repairs were needed. At the same time the bells were removed. Today the tower boasts a 14 full circle ring, the only one to exist worldwide. It also has two additional tenor bells. The 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4th sharp bell were cast in1992 by the Whitechapel Bell Foundry, whilst the rest of the bells were cast in 1997 by John Taylor & Co. There is one remaining bell, the B flat bell, which was cast in 1621 by Anthony Bond. This bell was transferred to the cathedral in 1967 from the redundant church of St Lawrence in Winchester.

# **National Teddy Bear Day 9th September**

On 9th September, National Teddy Bear Day honours the history of one of childhood's favourite toys. We have all had a special cuddly teddy as a child. Some of us still have our teddy bear from our childhood. No matter what kind of teddy bear you had, the day is a perfect time to celebrate your childhood friend!

In 1902, American President Theodore Roosevelt refused to shoot a bear cub while hunting in Mississippi. The incident made national news. Clifford Berryman published a cartoon of the event in the Washington Post on 16th November 1902, and the caricature became an instant classic.

The Berryman cartoon of Teddy Roosevelt and the cub inspired New York store owner Morris Michtom. He created a new toy and even had a name in mind. Michtom wrote to President Roosevelt to ask permission to name the new toy a "Teddy Bear."

Since the advent of the Teddy Bear, a parade of famous characters followed. Big Bird from Sesame Street named his Teddy Bear Radar. The lasagne loving cat celebrated on Garfield the Cat Day armed himself with Pooky, his lovable scapegoat. The British invasion of Teddy Bears includes Winnie-the-Pooh and Paddington. In 1981, the Care Bears first became greeting cards. Not long after, they launched into television and toy history. And let's not forget the Muppet character Fozzie Bear. The lovable and comedic bear endlessly perseveres with one-liners, slapstick and musical comedy.





# When Norman(s) Came To Britain

So, who learnt at school that the Norman Conquest began in 1066 when William decided that he wanted to be King of England and arrived from France and immediately met King Harold at Hastings fought a battle and won? Well, the reality was a bit more complicated.

On 5<sup>th</sup> January 1066, The King of England, Edward the Confessor, died. The very next day, the Anglo-Saxon council of high ranking men called the Witan, elected Edward the Confessor's brother-in-law, Harold Godwin, to be king. This did not please William, Duke of Normandy, who claimed that Edward the Confessor had promised the crown to him and also, in 1063, had tricked Harold into supporting his claim to be King of England. So annoyed was William that he decided to invade and take the throne by force!

Whilst this was happening, Harold's brother, Tostig, joined forces with Harold Hardrada who was King of Norway and had landed his army in Yorkshire. King Harold was having none of this, so led his own army north to fight off the invaders. After a forced march from London to Tadcaster, Harold launched a surprise attack to capture a bridge at Stamford on 25<sup>th</sup> September 1066. The battle that ensued was particularly fierce and bloody, with both Tostig and Harold Hardrada being killed, but resulting in King Harold's exhausted men being victorious.

Meanwhile, William had collected together a large force from all over France, with a contingent from Brittany and also one from Flanders. These men gathered together at Saint-Valery-sur-Somme and were ready to sail across the English Channel by 12<sup>th</sup> August. The size of William's army is largely unknown, but could have been anything up to 12,000, men including 3,000 cavalry. William also obtained Pope Alexander II's blessing for the invasion, although this was more likely given after the invasion! The invasion, though, was delayed until late September due to high winds. This proved advantageous to William who, on hearing that most of Harold's men were up north fighting at Stamford Bridge, decided to invade on 28<sup>th</sup> September.

Instead of landing at Hastings, the invading force landed at Pevensey. Over the next two weeks, William's men built a wooden castle near to Hastings and spent the time raiding the local area. Harold had probably decided that he had to return south as soon as possible on hearing of William's plans to invade. However, his army was exhausted and suffering from the trauma of battle, so Harold could only lead some of his army back the 200 miles to meet William.

The march south was arduous, and Harold had to stop in London for about a week to recuperate. His plan to surprise William failed, as William's scouts spotted his army early. It is not known exactly what happened when the two forces clashed, but it is thought that William led his men towards Harold's forces, which had taken up a defensive position at Senlac Hill (now known as Battle) in East Sussex. This is about six miles from Hastings.

The actual battle started at about 9am on 14th October 1066. There are differing tales as to what actually happened in the battle, but we know that the fighting was savage, with the Anglo-Saxons using battle axes against the Normans using swords. The famous anecdote of King Harold dying from an arrow in his eye is probably a myth, with the depiction on the Bayeux Tapestry likely to have been an addition to comply with 12<sup>th</sup> century stories. The truth is that probably no-one even saw how Harold was killed.

You would think that this was the end of the story, but this was not the case. The Anglo-Saxons did not accept William as king and elected Edgar AEtheling as king! Many more battles and skirmishes then took place, until eventually the English surrendered at Berkhamsted, with William finally being crowned king on 25<sup>th</sup> December 1066. William stayed in the country until March 1067 before returning to Normandy, with English prisoners, including Edgar AEtheling. Of course, the Normans stayed to control the country, but faced resistance for many years, whilst William was trying to beat off invaders to his other territories in Europe. William died in 1087 at the age of 59, to be succeeded by his son William II, also known as William Rufus.



# Parish Council Reports for July and August



Traditionally, planning applications are not included in the Council Report in the Parish Magazine, but it would be disingenuous not to mention the proposed development of 170 houses at Totham South. We seldom have members of the public at the monthly Council meeting; I have in the past joked that, generally speaking, residents must be satisfied with our performance. However, it is obvious from the number of people who attended the residents' meeting on 31st July, that this particular application has raised serious concerns, ranging from the lack of infrastructure, employment, school places etc to doubts about the current status of documents such as The Neighbourhood Plan to protect the continuing viability of the community. Developers build houses, but they are not benefactors and, as one of our residents mused, even with Section 106 contributions they cannot provide what is required to safeguard the character and identity of our village. It was a very civilised meeting and Councillor Delderfield expressed appreciation for the many insightful observations. Significantly, no-one present spoke in favour of the proposal. Full reports of this meeting and the Planning meeting which followed will be published on Facebook and the Parish Council website.

Another area in which resident opinion would be welcome is that of speed limits. The Speedwatch Team and Community Protection Team continue to record incidents of speeding. Councillor Atkinson has been contacted by the Safer Essex Roads Partnership Team (SERP) to enquire whether any communities would be interested in investigating a 20mph speed limit in problematic locations. SERP does not actually implement speed limits, and one can immediately see there might be a problem in enforcing such a move, but, at this point, the group is merely investigating the level of support for lower limits. We have also received two conflicting opinions on the current use of the lay-by at Bull Green, Totham South. As I recall, there was a certain amount of controversy when the village amenity was regularised some time ago, but it was obviously intended to facilitate short term parking for those visiting the village shop and no 'conditions' were considered necessary. Councillors have been monitoring the situation, and the Clerk is to contact Essex Highways to enquire whether a 30-minute time restriction would be appropriate. She has also been chasing up contractors to attend to the trees surrounding the cricket pitch and, mindful of the recent tragedy concerning a fallen tree branch, has been charged with obtaining information from other comparable sized parish councils, as well as Maldon District Council and Essex County Council, as to how they manage their tree stock.

I have to say I found the report of a fire at the Jubilee Recreation Ground rather disheartening. Councillors have spent considerable time and effort repairing apparatus and removing it to Bull Green where it is currently enjoyed by our younger residents. Councillor Gregan and his team have arranged for the 'Pit' to be tidied prior to refurbishment. He has been investigating grants, and a resident has also raised funds for new equipment, but it would be reassuring to know that the vandalism that precipitated the changes was a thing of the past so that a 'new' recreation ground could once more be appreciated and used responsibly.

As with all public bodies, procedures change and evolve, and our Clerk has been particularly efficient (and patient!) in guiding us through the many new and updated policies that Parish Councillors must now follow. In July, for example, we were presented with a Scheme of Delegation policy, a Data Retention policy, a Biodiversity policy and a Co-option policy, all of which, after discussion, were approved. We are fortunate that our new Clerk is not only experienced and conscientious but, in the tradition of our previous incumbent, a firm supporter of our community.

The September Parish Council meeting will take place at the Village Hall on Monday, 8th at 7.30pm.






