Reflection: Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> August 2025 Tenth Sunday after Trinity

Luke 13: 10-17

Have you ever talked to someone and realised they just haven't 'got it'? My wife says she often feels like that when she's talking to me! This is what this story is about, a religious leader so engrossed in being outwardly religious that he'd forgotten that being religious means 'being' something rather than just 'doing' something. Jesus saw right through him, grumbling that his perceived perception of religiosity was violated, while the woman who'd been wretched with back problems for 18 years, was healed, and immediately began to praise God. Note how the woman followed the true

reason for the sabbath by praising God when she was healed, while the religious leader just grumbled that healing the sick was a Monday to Saturday job. Jesus exposes the ridiculous nature of this argument by reminding him that watering animals on the sabbath was work yet they did it to save their livestock, how much more important was the healing of this woman. No wonder Luke tells us that the synagogue leaders were embarrassed, while the ordinary people rejoiced. The challenge of this reading to us is to remember that there is more to being Christian than going to church and being seen to do the right things.

  - nor shall there be any after me.
- 11 I, I am the Lord,


#### Or:

#### 1 Corinthians 4.9-15

- 9 For I think that God has exhibited us apostles as last of all, as though sentenced to death, because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to mortals.
- 10 We are fools for the sake of Christ, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honour, but we in disrepute.
- 11 To the present hour we are hungry and thirsty, we are poorly clothed and beaten and homeless,
- 12 and we grow weary from the work of our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure;
- 13 when slandered, we speak kindly. We have become like the rubbish of the world, the dregs of all things, to this very day.
- 14 I am not writing this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children.
- 15 For though you might have ten thousand guardians in Christ, you do not have many fathers. Indeed, in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

- 24 A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest.
- 25 But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors.

Our Churches continue to support local Foodbanks. Jubilee Foodbank Market Harborough You can drop off donations at Hallaton Church or to Linda Jones at 25, Eastgate, Hallaton at any time. Please note that all food collected is non-perishable, long-life or tinned.

The Foodbank has MOST URGENT NEED of:

Microwave rice, Corned beef, Tinned peas, Tinned ham, Tinned rice pudding, Tinned vegetarian meals, such as veggie chilli, Marmalade.

#### They also need:

Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Biscuits, Snacks and cereal bars, Coffee (small jars), Custard, Fruit squash/ juice, Hot dogs (tins or jars), Red meat: mince, stew, Bolognese, chilli, Pasta sauce, Microwave puddings, Pasta sauce, Peanut butter, Chicken in sauce, UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Tinned carrots, Tinned pasta, Dried potatoes (Smash), Crackers, Tinned sweetcorn, Tinned tomatoes, Fray Bentos pies, Sandwich paste, Teabags, Cup of Soup, Tinned potatoes, Tuna, Sugar (500g), Cup of soup, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

Generosity Week is a celebration of God's generosity that is lived out in our churches and parishes. It gives us an opportunity to engage with and support the wider community as we celebrate the generosity found. This isn't a celebration of 'our' generosity but God's, which is found within the church and outside it.

To start planning and promoting Generosity Week, take these three steps:

- 1. Pick a week the national week runs from Sunday 28 September to Sunday 5 October but if another time works better for you, do it then.
- 2. Choose what to do think what your church needs and look through the resources available (see below).
- 3. Plan your Sundays two Sundays works well as it gives

you one chance to explore gratitude and one to consider generosity. To get you started, there are service outlines, sermon starters and prayers — all generosity themed.
